RULES OF PROCEDURE

Student Tribunal of the University of Nebraska

I. The Hearing

1. Initiation of the Hearing. The Dean of the Division of Student Affairs or his representative shall present each case to the Tribunal which presentation shall contain a written statement of the facts prepared and signed by the defending student unless the defending student refuses to prepare and sign such a statement.

2. Time and Place. The Chairman of the Tribunal shall fix the time and place for each hearing. The Secretary of the Tribunal shall mail, at least five days prior thereto, notice of such time and place to the defending student and to the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs, unless such notice is waived.

3. Adjournments. The Chairman of the Tribunal for good cause may adjourn the hearing upon the request of the defending student or the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs or upon his own initiative.

4. Representation by Counsel. The defending student may be represented by counsel at the hearing if he so desires.

5. Order of Proceedings.

The Chairman of the Tribunal shall read the statement of facts prepared and signed by the defending student. The Dean of the Division of Student Affairs or his representative shall then present any additional facts. He and his witnesses shall submit to questions or other examination. The Chairman may, in his discretion, vary this procedure but shall afford full opportunity to all for the presentation of any material or relevant proofs.

6. Evidence. The defending student and the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs may offer such evidence as they desire and shall produce such additional evidence as the Tribunal may find necessary to understand and determine the case. All evidence shall be taken in the presence of the defending student except where he is absent in default or has waived his right to be present.

7. Absences. The hearing may proceed in the absence of the defending student if he fails to be present or fails to obtain an adjournment. In the event that the defending student and the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs agree that the statement of facts prepared and signed by the defending student con-

tains all the facts necessary for the disposition of the case, neither the defending student nor the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs need be present unless expressly requested by the Tribunal. No hearing shall proceed unless there are present at least four student members and one faculty member of the Tribunal.

8. Attendance at Hearings. Persons having a direct interest in the case are entitled to attend hearings. Upon the written request of the defending student the hearing shall be open to the public. In the absence of such request, it shall be discretionary with the Tribunal to determine the propriety of the attendance of any persons not having a direct interest. The Chairman of the Tribunal shall have the power to require the retirement of any witness during the testimony of other witnesses.

9. Closing of Hearing. The Chairman of the Tribunal shall specifically inquire of the defending student and the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs or his representative whether they have any further evidence to offer or witnesses to be heard. Upon receiving negative replies the Chairman shall declare the hearing closed.

10. Reopening of Hearing. The hearing may be reopened by the Chairman of the Tribunal on his own motion or upon the application of the defending student or the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs for "good cause shown, at any time before the decision is rendered.

II. The Decision

11. Time. The decision shall be rendered promptly, not later than thirty days after closing the hearing.

12. Form. The decision shall be in the form of a written recommendation addressed to the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs, signed by the Chairman and the Secretary of the Tribunal.

13. Scope. The Tribunal may make any decision which it deems just and equitable including, but not limited to, expulsion from the University, suspension from the University for a fixed time, conduct probation for a fixed time, conduct warning, or dismissal of the charges.

14. Majority Decision. A decision of the Tribunal shall be by a majority vote except that in the case of a decision recommending expulsion or suspension a two-thirds vote is required.

15. Delivery of the Decision. The Secretary of the Tribunal shall deliver the decision to the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs. The Dean of the Division of Student Affairs shall inform the defending student of the decision as well as his own disposition of the case. The Dean of the Division of Student Affairs shall also notify the Tribunal of such disposition.

III. Special Provisions

16. Record. The Secretary of the Tribunal shall keep a record of each case in a separate file. The record shall show the place, time, and date of the hearing, the presence of the defending student and counsel, if any, the presence of the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs, the statement of the facts of the case prepared and signed by the defending student, a list of the names and addresses of all witnesses, any exhibits offered in evidence during the course of the hearing, a copy of the decision made by the Tribunal, and a statement of the disposition of the case by the Dean of the Division of Student Affairs. The file containing such record shall be kept in an appropriate place, not open to the public inspection.

17. Amendments. These rules of procedure may be amended by a two-third vote of the Tribunal.

Women's Swim Program Opens

Starting October 5 the Coliseum swimming pool will be open for women students on Wednesdays from 7-8 p.m., according to the Women's Physical Education Department. Interested students are asked to report to the women's dressing room in the Coliseum, said P. E. officials. Swimmers will need to bring their own bathing caps. Suits and towels are provided. All women except freshmen and transfer students are required to obtain swimming permits from Student Health. The program is designed for recreation. There will be no instruction.

Old Campus Church Victim Of Progress; New Chapel Work Begins Next Week

Final worship services in the oldest student church on campus will be held Sunday at the Episcopal chapel at 13th and R.

The chapel, which was built in 1890, will be torn down the following week to make way for a new \$150,000 student center and chapel.

The project will be completed in two \$75,000 segments and is expected to be finished early next semester.

The first segment will consist of the student center and a temporary chapel in the basement. The second segment is the permanent chapel.

The single story structure will be made of textured brick with mosaic designs of panels and glass squares. Interior emphasis will be on simplicity with "no distracting features between the door and the altar."

Contemporary furniture will complete the various rooms which include a kitchen, dining hall, recreation room with double fireplace, and several study and meeting rooms.

A Cross-shaped window, the length of the west wall, has been designed especially for the chapel.

A special beauty spot will be found within the enclosed

court which will also provide an entryway. An office wing will face east.

Money for the project has been raised by gifts from Episcopal church people throughout the state.

In the future students from Justus Liebig will attend K-State on an exchange program. Later there will be an exchange of professors between the two universities.
