"Nebraska has better pursuit and is a more aggressive club than Colorado. Nebraska compares favorable to Colo-rado in the line," said Wildcat line coach John Kadlec after viewing the Kansas State-Nebraska game from the press box.

"Nebraska is good and tough. They have fine running backs and a good solid ball club. They are able to beat any team in the league," he

"Nebraska has more hitters than Colorado, but they aren't quite up to Kansas because Kansas has a great ball club and great speed," said backfield coach Bob Hailey.
