Eleven separate sessions will highlight the day.

Retailing Session

The first session starts at 9:30 a.m. and runs until 11:30 a.m. on retailing. William Gold II, president and general manager of Gold and Company, Lincoln, is the speaker. This session is scheduled for the auditorium.

Real estate and property management will be discussed by Howard Drew, vice president of the Byron Reed Company, Inc. of Omaha, at 9:30 a.m. in rooms four and five.

The 9:30 meeting is based on selling. R. N. Davis, training director of the Carpenter Paper Co. of Omaha will speak in the auditorium.

Warren D. Chiles, president of the Chiles-Schutz Company of Omaha is the speaker for the investment banking session also scheduled for 9:30.

Industrial Accounting
From 10:30 to 11:30, Bus Ad students will hear Lester E. Pankoni of General Electric who will talk about industrial accounting and E. Ross Martin of Partner, Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Co. of Lincoln on public accounting. Both discussions can be heard in the auditorium.
