Classes in basic slide rule operation will begin next week under the sponsorship of Sigma Tau, honorary fraternity for upperclass students in the college of engineering and architecture.

Tentatively scheduled as one class a week for the next six weeks, the course is intended for beginning students of engineering and the natural sciences. It is designed to give fundamental skill in the use of the slide rule as an aid to problem solution.

Undergraduate members of Sigma Tau are providing the instruction for the free non-credit course.

All classes will be held in room 111, Ferguson Hall with five sections scheduled:

Tuesday—7 to 8 p.m.
