

NU Ready For Cowboys

Ten Huskers Making Final Home Showing

Ten Nebraska seniors will be making their final home appearance of the season when the Huskers take on Oklahoma State's gridders Saturday at Memorial Stadium.

Senior gridders making their final appearance include right end John Bond, left guard Darrell Cooper, quarterback Pat Fischer, center Don Fricke, center Bob Kitchen, right guard Dick

Kosier, right tackle Roland McDole, left guard John Ponsseigo, left tackle Al Wellman, and right halfback Clay White.

The battle between the Cowboys and the Huskers is for sixth place in the Big Eight standings. Oklahoma State has a 1-3 conference mark while the Huskers are 1-4. The only league win for both schools came against Kansas State.

Nebraska defeated the Wildcats 17-7 earlier in the season and Oklahoma State got its first league win a week ago with a 28-7 victory over Kansas State.

A Husker win would assure Nebraska of a record equal to last year's mark when the Huskers won two and lost four in the conference and had a 4-6 overall record. Nebraska has lost three consecutive games and hasn't scored in the last two against Missouri and Kansas.

"Oklahoma State defensively is as fine a team as we've played," Nebraska head coach Bill Jennings said. "We have to be able to move the ball in order to win."

All Huskers are expected to ready physically for Saturday's contest with Gary Toogood recovering from a groin injury that sidelined him in the Kansas game.

Toogood probably draw the starting nod at left tackle ahead of George Haney and Dick McDaniel.

Others in the Husker starting line will be Bill Comstock at left end, Tyrone Robertson at left guard, Don Fricke at center, Dick Kosier at right guard, Roland McDole at right tackle and Don Purcell at right end.

The Nebraska starting backfield probably will find Pat Fischer calling signals, Pat Clare at left halfback, Clay White at right halfback, and Noel Martin at fullback.

Nebraska's six-man cross country team will compete in the Big Eight conference championship meet Saturday at Oklahoma State in Stillwater.

Runners representing Nebraska are Ray Stevens, Bill Kenny, Clarence and Joe Scott, Rich Kier, and Paul Nielsen.

Last weekend Nebraska won the Midwest AAU four-mile run in Omaha. At this meet Stevens set a new record for the course with a 21:06. Stevens also has the best time for the Huskers on the home course with a 15:13.5.

This season Nebraska won meets from Colorado, Iowa State and Drake, and lost to Kansas State and Missouri. Kansas with Bill Dotson, Kirk Hagan, Bill Hayward, Bob Linrud, Billy Mills, and Ted Reisinger is favored to dominate the cross country run for the 14th straight year.

Missouri, led by unbeaten Bob Henneken, will give the Jayhawks a fight for the championship. Henneken will be backed up by teammates Ray Schmitz, Joe Schroeder, Don Gabbert, Morris Patterson, Jim Shepard, and Jerry McFadden.

Coach Burl Berry of Iowa State will enter Karl Brown, Don Muyskens, Jan Petersons, John Highbarger, Earl Holtz, Charles Darby, and Bill Lynn.

In the Kansas State corner Coach Ward Haylett may be

The Wildcats will be entering Larry Wagner, Pat McNeal, Gene Mater, Bob Jadow, Bob Grosek, and Ed Mahoney. McNeal, a sophomore, crowded letterman Wagner all season and beat him in their last meet.

Colorado's forces will be spread rather thin, due to ineligibilities and drop outs, according to Coach Frank Potts. Eric Cahn, a senior, is the individual standout for the Buffs. Potts will also be entering John Patterson, Al Schmid, Tom Porven, and Jerry Epler in the conference.

Frosh Gridders Seek Second Win

Nebraska's undefeated freshman football team will host the Kansas State frosh at 2:00 p.m. today.

The Kansas State freshmen are undefeated this year after holding the Kansas gridders to a 0-0 tie at Manhattan, October 27.

The Husker frosh tripped the Iowa State freshmen last Friday 7-6 on a fourth quarter drive engineered by Iowa prep star, Charles Doepke.

K-State freshman coach Ed Dissinger says the Wildkittens are "ready to play—ready to give a good account of themselves," and has moved two Nebraska prep stars into the starting line-up. They are Spencer Puls, Holdrege, at left half, and Sam Sommerhalder, Minden, at right end.

Other expected starters for Kansas State are Larry Benson (212), right tackle; Bob Noblist (182), right guard; John Cunningham (185), center; Jerry Fitzsimons (205); left guard, Joe Provenzano (225); left tackle, Carl Brown (190); left end, Ralph McFillen (150) quarterback, Fred Stanfield (165), right half; and Junior Miller (190), fullback.

The Nebraska frosh have won the last two games from Kansas State since 1957 when the Wildcats romped 31-7. Nebraska won 15-0 at Manhattan last year.

The Huskers have a 14-

pound weight advantage overall. The Kansas State line averages 196.4 against Nebraska's 216.4 and the Huskers hold a 192.7-173.2 advantage in the backfield.
