

# Sports Doubleheader Set For Next Monday

## Husker Fans Will Get First Look at Cagers

Three juniors and two seniors will be in the starting lineup when cage coach Jerry Bush sends his Husker varsity against Tony Sharpe's freshmen in part of a twin sports attraction Nov. 28.

Mickey Sparano's varsity wrestlers will battle the freshmen grapplers at 7 p.m. and the cagers will take over at 8:15.

Bush's starting lineup will have junior Jan Wall (6-6) and senior Jim Kowalke (6-3) at the forward slots, junior Tom Russell (6-7) at center, and senior Al Roots (6-2) and junior Rex Swett (6-1) at guards.

The freshmen will enjoy a slight height advantage with the starting frosh lineup averaging 6-5 compared to 6-4 for the varsity.

Sharpe has indicated a starting lineup of Neil Nannen (6-4½) and Chuck Sladovnik (6-4) at forwards, Bill Vincent (6-8) at center, Charles Jones (6-3) and Daryl Petsch (6-5) at guards.

Four members of the freshman starting cast were all-state performers a year ago and the fifth player was named to the all-city team in Chicago, Ill.

### Nebraskans

Nannen, Sladovnik, and Vincent were all-state performers in Nebraska and Petsch was an all-stater at Marysville, Kans., High School. Nannen led his Syracuse team to state championships in 1959 and 1960, and Vincent was a main cog in the Omaha South team that captured the Nebraska class A championship in 1960.

Sladovnik was named to the Catholic all-America team as a member of the Omaha Holy Name team that was runnerup to Syracuse in Class B in 1960. Jones was an all-city performer in Chicago.

Backing up the freshman starting unit will be such high school standouts as John Nared of Omaha Central, Dennis Puelz and Keith Slick of Lincoln Southeast, and Roger Denesla of Wayne.

Nebraska's varsity is without its two leading scorers of a year ago in Herschell Turner and Al Maxey. Turner, now playing professional ball with Baltimore, led the Husker scorers with 362 points in 24 games for a 15.9 average per game.

Maxey, who is scholastically ineligible, was the number two scorer with a 12.2 per game average on 293 points in 24 games.

### Kowalke Third

Kowalke, one of only three seniors on this year's squad, was third in scoring a year ago with a 10.5 average. The Sioux City, Iowa, senior scored 252 points and was also third in rebounding with 144.

Bush says Nebraska's success depends on "how well our big men perform" and one of those big men is Russell, a 6-7 transfer from Independence Junior College in Independence, Kans.

Russell was a member of the junior college all-American team last year and led all scorers in the junior college championship tourney at Hutchinson, Kans.

Wall, one of the starting forwards, was fifth in team scoring during the 1959-60 season with a 5.3 average. Wall was top free throw shooter on the team, percentage-wise, hitting 31 of 39 attempts for a .795 percentage.

Roots and Swett give the Huskers a good ball-handling combination in the backcourt. The speedy pair will be leading Nebraska's fast-breaking offense.

Husker wrestling fans will see Mickey Sparano's squad in action for the first time this season in the freshman-varsity meet Nov. 28.

The freshman squad is stacked with four state champion wrestlers and three others who were runner-up.

Because of the equalness of the two squads, Coach Sparano said, "I hate to make any predictions of the winner—it will be a good match and it should be very interesting to those watching."

The depth which Sparano has boasted of becomes evident by looking at the lineups of the varsity and the freshmen. At the 115, 123, 157, and the heavyweight classes the wrestler hasn't been decided for sure.

Some of the freshmen grapplers who should be watched are Nebraska champions Jim Fuxa, Bud Ottmann, Bob Van Outery, and Jim Lytle. Metropolitan wrestling champion in Maryland.

Jim Raschke, Jim Faiman, Dan Hoevet, and Bruce O'Callaghan are returning members of last year's wrestling team and represent the experience of the varsity.

## MU Accepts Orange Bid

Missouri has accepted an invitation from the Orange Bowl committee to represent the Big Eight in the Orange Bowl at Miami, Fla., Jan. 2.

The Tigers were issued the invitation despite suffering their first loss of the season Saturday to Kansas by a 23-7 count. Missouri was ranked number one in the nation by Associated Press and United Press International the past week.

Kansas became the Big Eight champion with its win over Dan Devine's Tigers but the Jayhawks are ineligible for the bowl trip because of an NCAA-imposed ban for illegal recruiting.

The Orange Bowl committee will meet this week to name an opponent for Missouri with the choice probably being made from among Duke, Syracuse, Navy or Mississippi.

## 'I Just Told Them To Gut It Out'--Jennings

Nebraska grid coach Bill Jennings explained that he had merely told the Huskers to "gut it out" during Saturday's halftime break.

"This team has played hard all year," Jennings said. "Sometimes they got in the hole and couldn't get out . . . but they never quit."

"The players believed at halftime that they could come back and that's what's important. This was as good a comeback as we've had since I've been at Nebraska."

Jennings pointed out that he hadn't changed anything very much during the half-time meeting. "We didn't change anything very much in the

second half. We concentrated our offense more but basically we didn't change," the Husker head coach explained.

The Husker coach picked out the tackle by Purcell that caused the fumble and Thornton's run as being big plays during the contest.

Purcell lauded Jennings as

"the best coach in the nation." Purcell said, "We were a little awed in the first half by the noise and everything, but Coach Jennings told us at the half we could do it."

"He told us, 'You show no fear. Go out and suck 'em up. You can hit harder than this ball club.'"

"I'll tell you this. He's the best coach in the nation. He changed our offense and defense a little at halftime and that did it. He's just the best."

Thunder Thornton had special praise for Pat Fischer. "When we were down 14-0 we all felt pretty low," the full-back said. "But Fischer gave us pep and desire again. He gave us that extra spark we needed."
