

# Huskers Stun Aggies With 65-60 Upset

Nebraska rode the upset trail again Wednesday night as Jerry Bush's cagers upset seventh-rated Utah State, 65-60, with five points in the final 16 seconds.

The win gives Nebraska a 2-1 record with Denver invading the Coliseum Tuesday night. Denver has an 0-2 record with two losses to Regis College. The Pioneers play the Air Force Academy Saturday.

Utah State, ranked seventh

by United Press International, now has a 1-2 mark with a win over New York University and a loss to Detroit. All three games that the Aggies have played this season have been decided in the final 16 seconds or less.

Wednesday's contest was the first time this season that Nebraska has outscored the opposition in the second half. The Huskers went to the dressing room at halftime trailing 33-31, but outscored

the Aggies, 34-27, in the final half.

Tom Russell's lay in with 16 seconds left gave the Huskers the margin they needed for the win. The 6-7 junior college transfer added another point on a free throw with 3 seconds remaining.

**Clincher**  
Russell then pirated a desperation pass by the Aggies' Max Perry, and Russell passed off to Al Root who applied the finishing touch with a lay in as the final buzzer sounded.

The estimated 4,000 fans at the NU Coliseum were on their feet for the final minutes as Utah State took a 55-54 lead on a free throw by Cornell Green with 3:55 remaining. When Perry, a 5-10 sharpshooting guard, added a jump shot, the Aggies led 57-54.

Bush's hustling cagers came battling back on a short jump shot by Russell to pull within one point, and after Tyler Wilton hit a free throw for the Aggies, Jim Kowalke connected with a twisting jump shot to tie the score at 58-all with 2:08 left.

Utah State went ahead again on two charity tosses by Perry, but Kowalke countered with another jumper to make it 60-60. Nebraska gained possession of the ball with 41 seconds remaining and immediately called time out.

The Huskers bided their time and Russell broke loose under the basket for an easy lay in and the winning points.

Nebraska had four players in double figures in scoring with Kowalke and Russell leading with 17 and 16 respectively. Jan Wall added 13, 10 of them in the second half, and Rex Swett contributed 10.

Perry's 23 points on a variety of shots including two-hand sets, long jump shots, and lay ins led the Aggie scoring. Cornell Green added 16 and Charles Walker pumped in 12.

The balanced scoring attack of the victorious White team was accentuated by the fine performances of Chuck Sladovnik, former Omaha Holy Name star. The 6-4 hustler canned 17 points over the 6-8 Bill Vincent of the Reds in the foul-scarred tilt.

Sladovnik was aided by teammate Neil Nannen's identical 17 counters, most of which came on close-up hook shots. Omaha Central grad John Nared contributed 11 points to the White cause.

Four Reds kept the game close with their scoring, highlighted by a barrage of fielders midway in the final stanza. Vincent and soft-shooting Daryl Petsch both rimmed 17 points for the Reds. They were supplemented by Charlie Jones' 13 points and Keith Sieck's 10.

Nebraska's wrestling team opens its dual meet season against a veteran Kansas State team at 7:00 p.m. Saturday at the Coliseum.

Nebraska's team, which is just beginning to jell after last years 0-13 season, is tangling with the number four team in the Big Eight.

Fourth position in the Big Eight is a very relished laurel considering that Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, and Iowa State are ranked at the top of the NCAA wrestling chart every year.

Kansas State's John Dooley, 115 pound Big Eight champion, will be challenged by Husker Mike Nissen in a bout which should be one of the top matches of the evening.

Last week Nissen proved himself championship material by winning the Iowa State Teachers invitational 123-pound title by defeating Don Webster of Iowa State. Webster is the runner-up to Dooley in the Big Eight division.

If the slight concussion which Dick Van Sickle suffered in the frosh-varsity match doesn't handicap him,

his match against Darrel Huggins in the 130-pound division should also be a top match.

Jim Raschke runner-up in the Iowa Teachers Invitational heavyweight division will go against Don Darter, senior heavyweight from Kansas State.

Raschke and Darter drew in regular season competition last year and this match will be the first step in what Husker fans hope will end in conquest of the Big Eight title for Raschke which he lost by a referee's decision last year.
