

Huskers Score Easy Win

All 12 NU Cagers Hit Scoring Column

Nebraska led all the way in moving to a 77-52 win over Denver University before an estimated 2,500 fans at the Coliseum Tuesday night.

All the Husker cagers entered the scoring column with Jim Kowalke leading the parade with 16 points. He was followed by Jan Wall with 12. Tom Russell and Rex Swett added 10 each.

The win is the third of the season against a single loss for Coach Jerry Bush's cagers. The lone loss came at the hands of still-unbeaten Wichita.

Nebraska's widest margin came with 13:20 left in the game when a free throw and tip in by Bill Bowers gave the Huskers a 58-29 lead.

Denver was never in the game as the Huskers jumped off to an 11-0 lead before the Pioneers' Dennis Hodge found the range with a jump shot for the first Denver score. The 11-0 Husker margin came on a long jumper and a lay up by Wall, a jumper and a lay up by Russell, and Kowalke's lay up and charity toss.

Bench Emptied

Bush emptied his bench in the second half as reserves played three fourths of the final 20 minutes after Nebraska had taken a 40-21 halftime lead.

Nebraska finished the first half just as they started it with nine points in the final four minutes while holding the Pioneers scoreless. A jump shot and two free throws by Kowalke were major factors in the final spurt at the end of the first half.

The Huskers also scored the first six points in the second half on a twisting lay up by Swett, a corner jumper by Wall, and another jumper by Kowalke.

Kowalke scored 12 of his 15

points in the first half and then sat out most of the second half as the reserves took over.

The Huskers dominated the boards as well as the scoring with 65 rebounds to 43 for the losers. Russell led the Nebraska rebounding with 10. Bowers, getting his first start of the season, grabbed off nine and scored seven points.

Rick Barrett and Tim Vezie scored 12 points each to lead the Denver scoring. Hodge chipped in 10. Vezie led all rebounders with 12.

All Rebound

All Huskers but one, Jim Hoge, pulled down a rebound and only Bert Elie failed to connect from the field. Elie hit two of two free throws for his scoring total as all Huskers scored.

Nebraska hit 14 of 31 field goals in the first half for a .452 percentage, but cooled off during the second half to finish with a .394 percentage on 28 of 71 attempts.

Denver hit a frigid five of 34 attempts from the field in the first half and did little better in the second stanza with 14 of 65 for .215 per cent.

The Huskers converted 21 of 29 free throw attempts for a .724 mark while the Pioneers connected on 24 of 34 charity tosses for a .706 percentage.

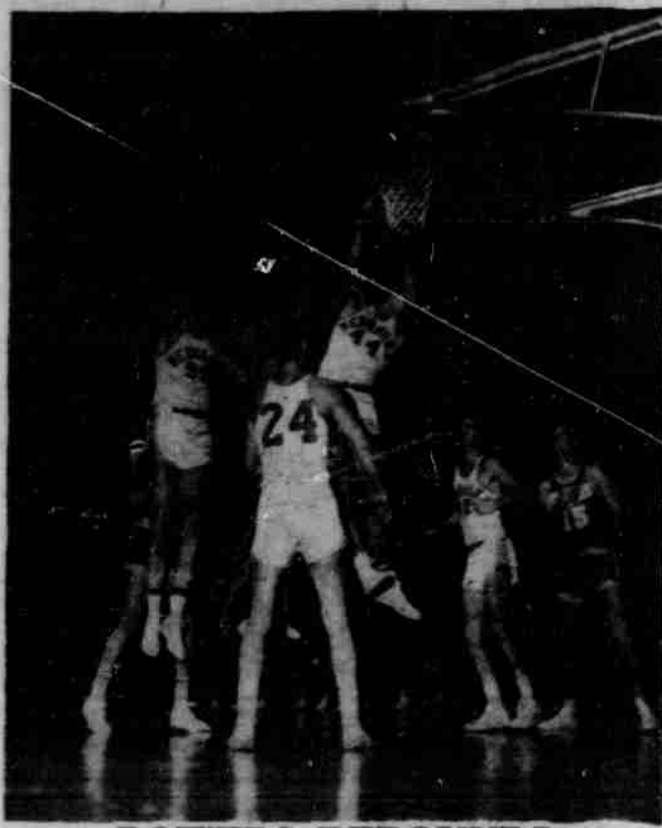

Don Smidt, former Husker star, teamed with Bob Prokop to give the Dents the 1-2 scoring and rebounding punch they needed throughout the game for the win. Joe Lytle hit 13 counters to supplement Smidt's and Prokop's 17 and 14 point exhibitions.

The frosh, hurt by the almost total loss of 6-8 Bill Vincent who saw only limited action early in the game, nearly fell too far behind in the first period to catch up. Vincent, who suited up for the game, was felled by a seige of flu.

Daryl Petsch, 6-5 center from Marysville, Kan., nearly pulled the game out alone with his deadly long shots. His 25-foot fielder with 7:30 remaining cut the Dent lead to two points after the All-Stars had experienced their coldest stanza of the game.

After four weeks of bowling in the Big Eight League, Nebraska stands in second place.

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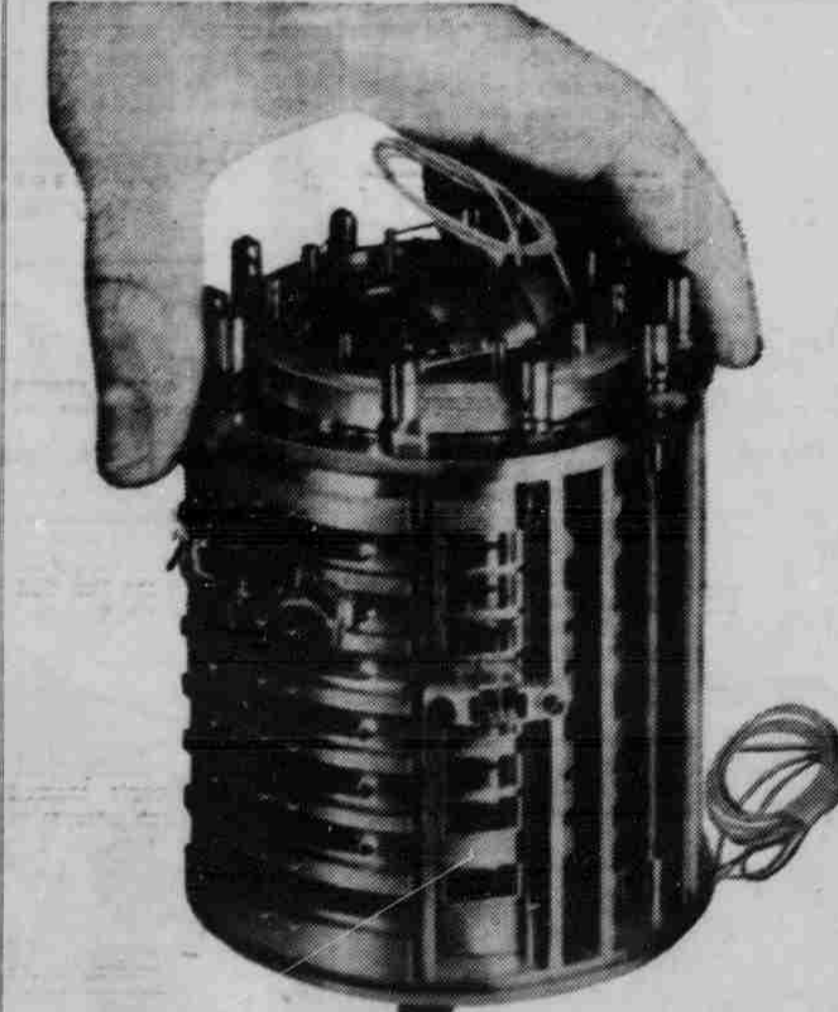
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
