

Swimmers Split in Duals

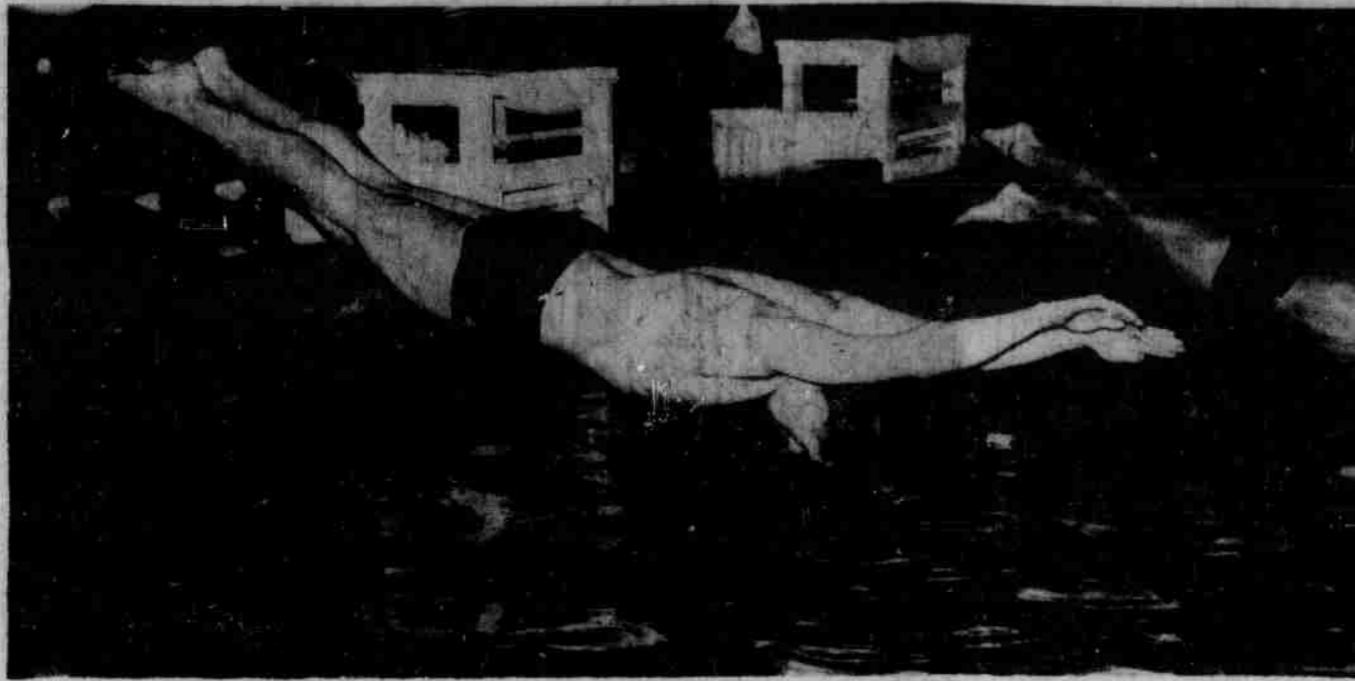
Jay Groth Sets Two NU Marks

Nebraska swimmers, for the second week in a row split in dual swim meets. Nebraska took Emporia State of Kansas Friday night, 64-40, but fell to mighty Oklahoma, 70-35, Saturday afternoon.

Nebraska set two varsity records in beating Emporia State. Sophomore freestyler Jay Groth knocked 11.5 seconds off the 440 record with a 5:02.4.

In the 400-yard freestyle relay the Huskers swam a 3:37.6 which is 7.4 seconds better than the old mark. Members of the team are Larry McClean, LaVern Bauers, Joe Gacusana, and Phil Swaim.

Husker Gymnasts Triumph In Triangular; Anstine Leads

Nebraska's gymnasts won their second meet of the young season Saturday by outscoring Colorado State University of Fort Collins, and Fort Hays State in a triangular at Ft. Hays, Kans.

The Huskers have yet to lose this season. Nebraska scored 81 points compared to Colorado State's 54, and Fort Hays' 18.

Coach Jake Geier's gymnasts capped first places in six of the seven events. Dennis Anstine led the Husker win with two first place finishes and a tie for first for 20 points.

Charles Williams won two events for 14 points. Doug Moore, Nebraska captain, also scored 14 points. Dick McCoy added 13, Louis Burkell 12, Herb Hanich 5, and Bill Brass 3 points.

Anstine was first on the sidehorse, horizontal bar, and tied for first on the parallel bars with Bruce Bowler of Colorado State.

Williams Wins Two

Williams picked up his two titles in the free exercise and tumbling. Moore captured the other Husker crown with a first place in rebound tumbling. The Husker captain was third on the horizontal bar, and fourth on the flying rings.

The lone event that Nebraska failed to win was the flying rings where Hopper of Colorado State edged Nebraska's Herb Hanich for first place.

The Huskers swept the first three places in tumbling with Williams, McCoy, and Burkell finishing 1-2-3 respectively.

Burkell placed in four events for Geier's gymnasts. He was fourth in free exercise, third on the parallel bars, sixth on the flying rings, and third in tumbling.

The Huskers next meet is Saturday when they travel to Lawrence, Kans., for a rematch with the Jayhawks. Nebraska defeated Kansas earlier this year.

Mullins Cops 600 Crown At Boston

Former NU Star Wins By One Yard

Joe Mullins dethroned Jim Stack of Yale when he won the 600-yard run in 1:12.0 in the Boston Knights of Columbus Track Meet.

Mullins, a senior at Nebraska, won by a yard over the second place man, Jim Wederburn of NYU. His greatest moment of anxiety occurred when Stack fought for the lead in the last lap. Mullins produced that famous kick of his and broke the tape first, with Stack placing third.

In 600-yard run competition Mullins has only lost one race in three years of college competition.

Mullins said that going into the meet Stack was the favorite in the 600 event. "I had to win this one to get other invitations. It sure feels good to beat the favorite," he said.

On Saturday Mullins will compete in the Los Angeles Invitational meet. A week later, Jan. 28, he will compete in Winnipeg, Canada. He has also accepted the invitation to run in the Milrose Games in New York City on Feb. 4.

Fort Hays Wrestlers Edge Nebraska, 15-13

Fort Hays wrestlers squeaked by Nebraska, 15-13, in a meet highlighted by two Nebraska pins Saturday night.

Huskers Jim Raschke and Dick Van Eickle both scored pins in their matches, but the Fort Hays Tigers were able to win five of the remaining six matches and the team victory.

Husker heavyweight Jim Raschke, turned in the outstanding performance of the evening when he pinned Terry Pfannenstiel in 58 seconds.

Raschke's pin was the finale of the meet. The other Husker pin was scored in 6:02 of the 130 pound division by Dick Van Sickle.

Jim Faimon was the only other Nebraskan to reach the scoring column.

Faimon, one of last season's mainstays, nearly pinned his man in one of the evening's best matches, but he had to settle for a 10 to 3 decision.

The Husker squad was handicapped by an injury to Mike Nissen. He suffered a sprained ankle during a Dec. 18 workout.

The Fort Hays Tigers took the lead from the start when Marvin Schultz decided Gary Policky, substitute for tri-

Bufs Snap NU Win String at 4

Nebraska's four-game winning string came to an end Saturday night as Colorado avenged an earlier loss at the hands of the Huskers with a 66-51 win at Boulder.

The Bufs dropped a 65-61 decision to Nebraska last Monday night in an overtime battle. The loss leaves Jerry Bush's Huskers with a 2-1 mark in conference play and 8-5 on the season.

Colorado has a 2-1 conference record and a 10-4 mark for a season record.

The Bufs started strong, hitting 58 per cent from the field to build a 41-27 halftime margin and the Huskers never caught them.

Ken Charlton, who finished with 20 points, and Wilky Gilmore led the early surge for Sox Walseth's cagers. Nebraska closed the gap to 10 points and 50-40 early in the second half, but couldn't overcome the early lead enjoyed by Colorado.

Rex Swett, who didn't arrive until just before game time, led the Husker scoring with 15 points. The Husker sparkplug had to remain in Lincoln for an exam Saturday morning before flying to Boulder.

Bill Bowers added 12 for Nebraska as the Huskers were playing their third straight

game without senior Jim Kowalke, one of the leading scorers. Kowalke is sidelined with a sprained ankle.

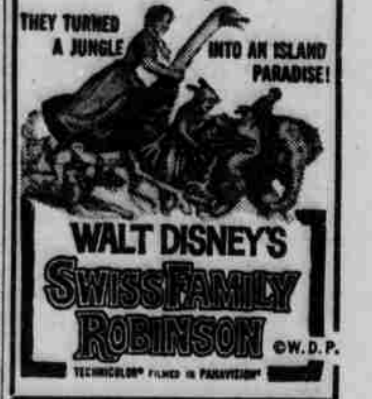
Nebraska's next outing will be Saturday when Iowa State invades the Coliseum for an 8:05 p.m. clash.
