to be too loud. Gene Dybdahl, in the same role, demands more attention.

Technically, the fragmentary settings suggesting the realism of the West and the appropriate properties are large plus factors. Lighting tends to be spotty and unblended, also hindered opening night by a short power failure in Act One. Costumes are appropriate, with two exceptions. Bothwell's costume is wrongly the stereotyped 'black villain' bit — only a black mustache needed for the type to be complete. The white dress "Catie Kate" wears in Act Two distracts, absorbing most of the light because of its absence of color. Here, too, a stereotype takes precedence — a bad girl turned good, with white to show her newly gained purity.

With some rewriting and reworking and with the right cast and director, "The Sweetwater Affair" could be a compelling production. As it is now, the opera is a gathering of individual musicians performing not as a group, but in a group. The 'concert' is complete, but the 'play' is hidden. However, "The Sweetwater Affair" has many qualities of originality and imagination that make it an effort worth attention. It was recognized as such opening night by a most receptive audience.
