

# NU Loss String Reaches 5

## Husker Ball Control Nearly Topples KU

Nebraska's cagers, unsuccessful in a slow-down game against Kansas Saturday, will try to snap a five-game loss string against Iowa State tonight on the Cyclone planes.

A win would move the Huskers into a fifth-place tie with Oklahoma State and would drop Iowa State into seventh place with a 3-6 mark. A Nebraska loss would leave the Huskers in sole possession of the league cellar with a 2-6 record.

Nebraska is tied for seventh place with Oklahoma. Iowa State fell to Kansas State, 66-65, Saturday night after leading by 10 points late in the game. Iowa State downed the Huskers, 66-58, earlier in the season at the Coliseum.

Husker coach Jerry Bush threw a ball control game at Kansas Saturday night and for most of the game it looked like Nebraska fans might see a repeat of the 1958 upset win over the Jayhawks with Wilt Chamberlain.

But the final result was not the same as three years ago and Kansas pulled out a 38-33 decision in the final minutes. After coach Dick Harp's Jayhawks grabbed a 34-29 lead with 2:38 remaining for the longest lead of the game, Nebraska came battling back to pull within two at 33-35 on a short jump shot by Bill Bowers with 1:14 left.

**Fouls Necessary**  
The Huskers were forced to foul in an attempt to get the ball in the final minute and Kansas pulled away to the final five-point spread on two free throws by Dee Ketchum and one by 6-8½ Wayne Hightower.

Nebraska tried only 19 shots during the game and connected on 11, most of them layins. The Husker field goal percentage was .579 while Kansas hit only .256 from the field on 10 of 39.

The difference came at the charity stripe where Kansas hit 18 of 25 for .720 and Nebraska made 11 of 16 for .688. Nebraska controlled the opening tip and immediately went into a slow-down game. The Huskers took their first shot after three minutes had elapsed with Bowers hitting an easy layin.

Bush's cagers increased the margin to 5-0 on a layin by Rex Swett and a free throw by Al Roots. Kansas tied the score at 5-all on a jump shot by Hightower and the two teams exchanged the lead the rest of the half.

Free throws by Swett and Roots gave the Huskers a 15-13 edge late in the opening stanza, but a tipin by Bill Bridges with four seconds remaining knotted the score at 15-15 as the half ended.

Hightower, the league's number-two scorer with a 21.8 average, was held to 12 points by the Husker style. Jerry Gardner of Kansas State led all scorers with 14 points.

Swett topped the Nebraska scoring with 10, followed by Bowers with nine and Tom Russell with eight.

A brief flareup early in the first half between Roots and Jayhawk Nolen Ellison brought the fans to their feet, but the uprising was quieted shortly and Roots was awarded a free throw.

Hightower was charged with a technical foul in the first half for arguing with a referee. Swett stepped to the line and pumped in the free throw to give Nebraska 14-13 lead.

# Husker Thinclads Unbeaten

Nebraska's track team easily overpowered Drake and Iowa State in a triangular meet Saturday by winning 8 of 14 first places.

The best performances were turned in by Drake's mile relay team which whittled three seconds off the Memorial Stadium record and by Victor Brooks, a freshman broad jumper, who leaped 24-5½ in an exhibition.

Had he been competing in varsity action the little Jamaican would have shattered the stadium record by one inch.

Coach Frank Sevigne's thinclads scored in every event for a total of 75½ points. With their powerful middle distance unit Drake earned second spot with 51 points. Iowa State, competing without star sprinter J. W. Burden, was held to 23½ for third place.

After the Husker win Coach Sevigne said, "I'm very pleased to say the least. The guys came through very well."

**Knab's Best**

Co-captain Bob Knab leaped 23-8½ for a Husker first in the broad jump. The mark is the best ever for Knab indoors. Fred Wilke placed third in this event with a jump of 23-0.

Again the 60-yard high and low hurdles were the strong points in the Husker showing. Wilke won the lows in :07.1 with Milt Haedt and Bill Fasano following for third and fourth places.

In the highs Fasano topped the timbers in :07.4 with Wilke and Haedt earning third and fourth. In both events Don Corbin of Drake edged in for the number two position.

In the 60-yard dash Steve Pfister won for the Huskers

Nebraska heavyweight Jim Raschke pinned Adams State heavy Gene Moses in 5:20.

Both meets were draw conscious as Jim Woods of the Air Force and Dick van Sickle of Nebraska, Joe Zleski of the Air Force and Harold Thompson of Nebraska drew in the 130 and 167-pound events respectively Saturday.

Larry Lebruka of Nebraska and Larry Moore tied in the 147-pound bout at Adams State along with Dave Luov of Nebraska and Rich Duvall in the 167-pound match.

# Nebraska Frosh Score Easy Win

A tall and talented Nebraska freshman basketball team proved its worth Saturday night by completely routing Fairbury Junior College, 80-52.

This clash was the first of a four-game season for Coach Tony Sharpe's cagers. All previous contests have been of the intrasquad variety.

The junior Huskers took an early lead from the highly-touted Fairbury squad via the sharpshooting of Charlie Jones, who compiled a total of 17 counters during the game. His two field goals and a charity toss put the Nebraskans in the lead for good.

The Bombers finally found the range in the form of a Terry Rieke jump shot after two minutes had elapsed. But a four-minute drouth following Fairbury's initial score put the game on ice.

Forward Daryl Petsch hit for four quick points as did former Lincoln Southeast star Kieth Sieck during this four-minute period. Petsch ended the evening with 11 points. Sieck hit for nine counters.

Vincent Hooks Fairbury's attack at this point seemed to be on the verge of collapse and two quick out-of-the-corner hook shots by big 6-8 Bill Vincent assured the outcome of the game.

Vincent's combination of patented hooks and long jump shots seemed to stun the invading Bombers to the point of frustration throughout the evening. The Omaha South grad had a total of 24 points for the game.

Scoring honors of the evening, however, go to Rieke, a freshman on the Fairbury squad from Chester. The 6-4 hustler peppered the bucket for 27 counters.

The 10-man squad left Sunday with the varsity for Ames, Ia., for their second game Monday night with the Iowa State freshmen.
