

Orwig: I Won't Bother NU

Says He Won't Try To Lure Nebraskans

Nebraska Athletic Director Bill Orwig said Thursday he has no intention of trying to lure either athletes or coaches from the University.

"I am sorry to be leaving Nebraska and I certainly don't want to do anything to hurt the University or its athletic program," Orwig said. "I have no intention of trying to get any of the coaches or athletes now at the University to come to Indiana."

Orwig announced his resignation as Nebraska's athletic director Monday after accepting a similar post at Indiana. Orwig will remain at Nebraska until April 1 when he will assume his new duties.

He said his first task at Indiana will be trying to persuade the NCAA to reduce or remove the four-year ban placed on the Hoosier school a year ago for recruiting violations.

"I already have begun to work on the problem and we have some irons in the fire now," he said. "The first move is up to the people of Indiana to show their good intentions."

Indiana is building a modern athletic plant with most of the construction completed. The Bloomington, Ind., school has a new stadium seating 50,000 and a new fieldhouse.

They are due to begin construction soon on a new sports arena for basketball and other winter sports, according to Orwig. The arena will include facilities for an ice floor although Indiana does not have a hockey team.

Three names entered the picture Tuesday as speculation began on a probable successor to Orwig. Persons mentioned were L. F. "Pop" Klein, A. J. Lewandowski and Bill Jennings.

Klein is currently assistant to the athletic director and handles concessions at athletic contests. Lewandowski is business manager of athletics and was athletic director when Orwig was named to the post in 1954.

Jennings, Husker football

coach, is reported to be first in line if University officials decide to combine the position with that of a head coaching job.

Orwig said he does not plan to make any recommendations regarding his successor. "It is up to the Board of Regents," Orwig said.

Matmen Go After 3rd Straight Win

Nebraska wrestlers will be seeking revenge when they go after a third straight win tonight against Kansas State at Manhattan.

The Wildcats scored a 16-10 triumph over Nebraska earlier in the season. The Huskers won two meets the past weekend to bring the season record to three wins, two losses, and one tie.

Kansas State is unbeaten in eight dual meets this season and scored a 25-2 triumph over Missouri in the Wildcats' last outing.

Two Husker grapplers still have undefeated records. Mike Nissen, a 123-pounder, leads the Nebraska matmen with 21 points and a 5-0 record. Jim Faimon, a Nebraska School for the Blind graduate, has scored 20 points with a 6-0 mark. Faimon is a 137-pounder.

Heavyweight Jim Raschke has posted a 5-1 record and has 19 points. The addition of Harold Thompson and Gary Klemesrud to the Husker roster has given Coach Mickey Sparano added strength for the second semester.

Four of Coach Fritz Knorr's Wildcat wrestlers are unbeaten in dual matches. Wayne Stanley, 157-pounder leads the team with six wins and a draw. Seniors Dee Gard and Larry Word have three wins in as many matches, but both have missed action because of trouble in making weight.

Denton Smith, a 177-pounder who joined the squad just before the Missouri meet, scored a 10-2 decision over Tiger Buch Russo.
