'Fair' Replaces Drill For Cadets

A new "county fair" type laboratory has been put into effect for the basic Army ROTC students at the University.

The "county fair" lab, which will extend over a period of three weeks, gives the basic ROTC student a chance to see and learn more about Army life, replacing three weeks of drill sessions.

Each week, on a battle group rotation basis, the cadets attend lectures and demonstration on squad tactics and formations, communication, weapons and advanced ROTC course motivations.

After the first week Brigade Commander Cadet Brig. Gen. Donald Epp noted that the change was favorable with the basic cadets.

"The three week break in the drill session gives the cadets added insight to the outstanding Army ROTC program we have at the University," Epp said.

The demonstrations and lectures are all presented by the senior Advanced ROTC students.
