Opening Drills Draw 54 NU Frosh Gridders

Kent McCloughan of Broken Bow heads a long list of former prep greats among the 54 freshman football candidates under coach Jack Bradley this fall. The Cornhusker freshman squad started drills yesterday.

Aside from the versatile McCloughan, who was named the top Nebraska high school athlete of 1960-61, include six other Cornhusker all-stars: Dave Banks of Wausa, Gene Cunningham of Fullerton, Gary Graham of Ravenna, Dennis Kirby of David City, Dwane Novak of Omaha, and James Murphy of Valentine.

John Sebastian of Oak Park, Ill., Raymond Opp of Glendive, Mont., and Willie Paschal of San Antonio, Texas, are among the top performers from other states.

Opp, a six feet, 175 pound back, has run the 100 yard dash in 9.8, while Sebastian has been clocked at 9.9 in the century.

Terry Rusthoven of Omaha, who piloted the winning South squad in the High School Shrine game this summer, will be bidding for a signal-calling berth on the frosh team.

Bradley's young Huskers have games on tap with Iowa State in Lincoln, October 27

and Kansas State at Manhattan, November 10th. Bradley's frosh club went undefeated last fall, winning from Iowa State 7-6 at Ames, and trimming Kansas State here, 21 to 6.

Thirty-two Nebraskans are on the 1960 freshman squad. Nine other states are represented with six Illinois grid men leading the out-of-state check-out lists.

Huskers Prepare For Sioux Air Attack

Coach Bill Jennings sent his Nebraska gridders through an hour and a half practice Monday, with special emphasis on pass defense.

The Huskers, who open their season against North Dakota Saturday in Lincoln, will also work on team offense and defense, with little rough stuff planned for the remainder of the week, the head coach announced.

Fifty-three Huskers will suit up for the game with Noel Martin, Pat Salerno and Larry Donovan being sidelined due to injuries. Soph tackle Bob Brown from Cleveland, Ohio should be ready for Saturday's game, Jennings said Monday.

NU assistant coach Dick Monroe, who watched North Dakota surprise Montana State 46-0 last Saturday, described the Sioux's chief weakness as a "lack of depth."

"North Dakota has some ends quite capable of playing

Big Eight football. They execute offensively with great efficiency. In sophomore Bob Glas, North Dakota has a potentially great quarterback," Monroe said.

Glas threw three touchdown passes in the North Dakota romp over Montana State, a team favored to beat the Sioux. "Montana State didn't get off the ground," Monroe commented.

"Any team that can run up a 46-0 score regardless of their opponents cannot be taken lightly. We must be ready for a hard hitting, aggressive football game," he added.

Monroe had special praise for Sioux left end Gene Tetrault. "He (Tetrault) is a good receiver and he runs pretty well with the ball after he catches it."

Jennings described the North Dakota invasion Saturday as a "good test." "There is a possibility of North Dakota having a pretty good football team," he said.

Nebraska will start a near-all-veteran lineup Saturday. The only two sophomores presently running on the first team are Brown, 251-pound tackle, and quarterback Dennis Claridge.

Sophomores on the second unit include right guard Ed Mitchell, right half Willie Ross, fullback Rudy Johnson and right end Larry Tomlinson.

The Husker first unit includes: Don Purcell, left end; Bob Jones, left tackle; Dwain Tingelhoff, center; Tyrone Robertson, right guard; Bob Brown, right tackle; Dick McDaniel, right end; Claridge, quarterback; Thunder Thornton, left halfback; Pat Clare, right halfback; and Bill Comstock, fullback.

Besides the four sophs, other Cornhuskers on the second team are Jim Hoge, left end; Gary Toogood, left tackle; Dallas Dyer, left guard; George Hanev, right guard; Al Fischer, right tackle; John Faimon, quarterback; and Bernie Clay, left halfback.

Jennings had special praise for quarterback Ron Gilbreath and linemen Gene Kirby, Hoge, Tomlinson, Jones, and Hanev after viewing the films of Friday's scrimmage.

The Huskers were impressive in their final scrimmage Friday. The Reds downed the Whites 48-6 in the finale, which featured plenty of passing and some sharp running by the NU backs.

In particular the aerial work of quarterbacks Claridge and Gilbreath stood out. Claridge hit 10 for 15 passes for 138 yards and two touchdowns.

Gilbreath, who directed the White attack, completed six passes as he guided the fired-up Whites to their only score

of the day after the Reds had scored three TD's.

Not only were the passers outstanding in the scrimmage but the receivers did some Tomlinson, Hoge and Dick Callahan made some good catches along with backs Clare and Maynard Smith. The running phase of the NU offense was impressive also, despite the absence of Thornton due to a hip bruise.

Clay had a fine day, including a 21-yard TD sprint. Claridge, along with his accurate passing, also turned in some fine runs. The 6-2, 200-pound field general went 42 yards on a quarterback sneak for the second Red score.
