

# Student Council Holds First Meeting; Standing Committee Selections Made

The main business of the first meeting of the University's Student Council was the appointment of standing committees for the coming year by Council president Steve Gage.

Chairman of the four key areas are: Jim Samples, Student interest, Al Plummer, academic and faculty; John Abrahamson, public relations and John Nolan, public issues.

The newly organized Public Issues Area will be of special interest to the Council, students and faculty this year.

Initiated by Gage last spring, the Public Issue area members will "investigate their duties" previous to undertaking studies and initiating discussions in student, faculty, state and national areas which relate to the student.

"We may possibly move into areas where private organizations are now acting," said Gage, "but we will endeavor only to create new ideas which can be adapted by the existing group, not to take over."

Emphasizing that the Council would concentrate on going into areas now deficient, Gage mentioned as an example, the possibility of receiving the now defunct Nebraska University Council on World Affairs.
