to roll over and play dead. Sioux Coach Whitey Helling has said, "Nebraska is clearly out of our league and one of the better teams in the country. We are honored to be on their schedule and will pull all stops to try to make it an interesting game."

Husker fans may well remember one of the few years Nebraska had an easy opening game when Nebraska was stunned by Hawaii 6-0 in 1955.

The Sioux have been picked to win the North Central Conference title and opened the season last weekend, walloping Montana State 46-0.

The Sioux attack is based on the aerial arm of Bobby Glas, sophomore quarterback, and the running of Bill Haberhorn and Glas.

Glas, former third-string signal-caller, was pressed into action last week when the number one and two quarterbacks were injured in practice. Glas responded by throwing three touchdown passes,

completing seven of 13 tosses and making several fine runs. Haberhorn, 192-pound senior right halfback from Florence, Wis., is considered a good steady performer who runs very hard.

Depth Advantage
The main advantage the Huskers will have over the Sioux is depth. Nebraska is two-deep in lettermen at almost every position and, in addition, has several outstanding sophomores, including six on the first two units.

Nebraska also has a weight advantage over the NoDaks. The Husker first and second units average weight is 206 and 201 respectively, compared to North Dakota's 195 and 196 top two teams' average weights.

The top Husker line averages 214 pounds per man compared to North Dakota's 200.

Coach Jennings has described his team at "near top strength," and in the best con-

dition, injury-wise, of any team he's coached.

The NU coach tabbed three Huskers Thursday as two-position players. Dallas Dyer, 188-pound senior from Lexington, can play either of the guard positions and Dick Callahan, soph from Sioux Falls, S.D. can perform at right half or left end.

Donovan, who will miss the opener due to a broken finger, has seen action this fall as a right end and left guard.

Jennings announced that Warren Powers, left halfback from Kansas City, will replace the quarterback on defense Saturday. The 188-pound junior will play the defensive halfback spot.

Jennings also reported that linemen Bob Jones and Mick Tingelhoff, who suffered minor injuries this week, should be ready to go Saturday.

Nebraska's Cornhuskers, who open their 1961 football season tomorrow against North Dakota, will be in unusual role for Husker openers—the favorite.

The game, which will start at 2 p.m. at Memorial Stadium, will pit the Huskers against the NoDak Sioux, a team whose desire may make up for its lack of depth.

This will be the first year since Coach Bill Jennings took over the NU coaching chores in 1957 that Nebraska has been the favorite in its season opener.

The Huskers opened against Washington State in Jennings' initial year, Penn State in 1958 and Texas the last two years. The Scarlet and Cream, however, have managed to pull two opening day upsets (14-7 over Penn State in '58 and 14-13 defeat of Texas last year).

This will be the first meeting between North Dakota and Nebraska in the history of the two schools and Nebraska is considered a heavy favorite to win.
