Nebraska will attempt to go ahead in the grid series against Colorado Saturday when the Huskers face the Buffs at 2 p.m. at Memorial Stadium.

Nebraska and Colorado have each won nine games in the series which dates back to 1898. In the past ten years the Buffaloes have won six, lost three and tied one against NU. The last Husker victory came two years ago in Lincoln when Nebraska edged the Buffs 14-12.

Last year Colorado trimmed the Huskers 19-6 in a game sparked by a 96-yard kickoff return by CU's halfback Teddy Woods.

Woods is back this year and so are many others as the Buffs have compiled a 6-1 record and are undefeated in Big Eight play. The Buffs appeared a certainty for the Orange Bowl and an undefeated season until last week when they were upset by Utah 21-12.

Heading Coach Sonny Grandelius' crew is Woods, quarterback Gale Weidner, the league's leading passer; end Jerry Hillebrand, pass-catching end and place-kicker, rumored to be a top draft choice this year; Loren Schwenzinger, hard-charging fullback; and Joe Romig, All-American senior guard who is considered to be the best lineman in Colorado history.

Nebraska Coach Bill Jennings reported yesterday that tackle Bob Brown is out of Student Health and there is a possibility that he may play. Brown had been sidelined with tonsillitis.

Also on the doubtful list for the Huskers are backs Willie Ross and Rudy Johnson.

Kappa Sigs Edge Betas

Intramural basketball excitement started Tuesday night as Kappa Sigma, two time all-University champ, conked arch rival Beta Theta Pi 40-39.

It was the seventh meeting in three years between the two perennial contenders for the University fraternity crown and for three quarters it looked like the Betas had finally killed the giant.

But Steve Scholder, K-Sig ball handling genius, ripped in four long jump shots to spark a comeback that saw his club erase a 12 point half time deficit. His last leaper and a free throw by Bob Prokop gave the champions a three point bulge that two free throws by the Beta's Jim Goodell in the final 30 seconds could not erase.

Scholder finished with 14 while Prokop, beginning his sixth intramural campaign, contributed 13. The Betas had a pair of outstanding individuals in Goodell, who out-toughed the K-Sigs under the basket for 15 and Ron Douglas, 5'9" nifty at guard who had 9. Other Tuesday night scores:
