Bush to Start 3 Sophs Against Lowly Hawks

Three sophomores will be in the starting lineup when Nebraska takes the floor against Kansas in a Big Eight basketball encounter at 8:05 p.m. tonight in the NU Coliseum.

Husker Coach Jerry Bush indicated he would start sophs Bill Vincent, Denny Puelz and Charley Jones against the Jayhawks tonight. All three turned in good performances as the Scarlet downed Missouri, 65-63, in their last outing.

The three will combine with vets Ivan Grube and Tom Russell as the starting five as Nebraska will attempt to stay solidly entrenched in the first division in the conference race with a win.

The Huskers are currently in fourth place in the Big Eight standings with a 4-5 currently in the league cellar, is essential if the Huskers are to remain ahead of fifth place Oklahoma State. NU meets the Cowboys on a southern swing to Oklahoma next weekend.

Nebraska and Kansas have met twice this year with each team owning a close verdict. Kansas edged NU, 69-68, in the Big Eight pre-season tourney in Kansas City, but the Huskers bounced back to stop the Jayhawks, 69-67.

Kansas has won one and lost eight in Big Eight play and stands 5-15 for the season. Nebraska has won eight and lost 12 over the season. Kansas guards Nolen Ellison and Jerry Gardner have been billed as the best in the conference and they have carried the scoring load for KU this year.

The Kansans are a little shorter than usual with their tallest starter, center Lee Flachsbarth measuring 6-5. Other openers for the Jayhawks will be forwards Jim Dumas (6-1) and Harry Gilson (6-3), along with Ellison (6-1) and Gardner (5-11 1/2).

Bush had special praise for Vincent, 6-8 soph pivot who scored 11 points and hauled in eight rebounds against the Tigers.

"Vincent came of age against Missouri," he said. "Not only was he scoring better, but he was going into the defensive backboards with authority."

Jones, who led the NU scoring against Missouri with 17 points, and Puelz also drew laurels from their mentor. "Both will see plenty of action against Kansas tonight," Bush said.

Russell continues to lead the Husker scoring chart with a 15.8 average on 316 points in 20 games.

Wrestlers Tip Missouri, 22-14, for Seventh Win

A clean sweep of the lower weights started the Nebraska mat men on the path to a 22-14 victory over Missouri last night.

The dual win at Columbia marked Coach Bob Mancuso's third Big Eight win in as many starts and sent the Huskers' season record to 7-1-1.

Frosh Play LJC Tonight

A two-unit platooning system has been set up by frosh coach Bob Gates for tonight's cage battle with Luther Junior College on tap at 5:45 p.m. in the Coliseum.

Gates lists Gary Haas, the leading scorer for the Nebraska yearlings, at starting center. Earl Wright and Larry Bornschlegl are at the guard spots on the probable lineup with Joel Kortus and Jack Cramer at forwards.

The alternate unit will find Larry Martin and Mike Willets at guards, Bob Cook and Arnie Ginsburg at forwards, with John Jepsen at center. The Nebraska freshmen have a 1-1 record with a win over Iowa State and a loss at the hands of Kansas State.

Two undefeated Tigers fell as the Nebraska grapplers zoomed to a 22-0 lead after the initial six bouts.

Jim Faimon convincingly handled Mizzou's unbeaten Bob Blanner, 11-6, at 137 and Harold Thompson picked up the final Husker win of the evening, handling Rick Adams his first dual loss of the season, 5-1, at 157.

Coach Mancuso revamped his forces in the heavier weights when Husker heavyweight Jim Raschke couldn't make the trip because of sickness.

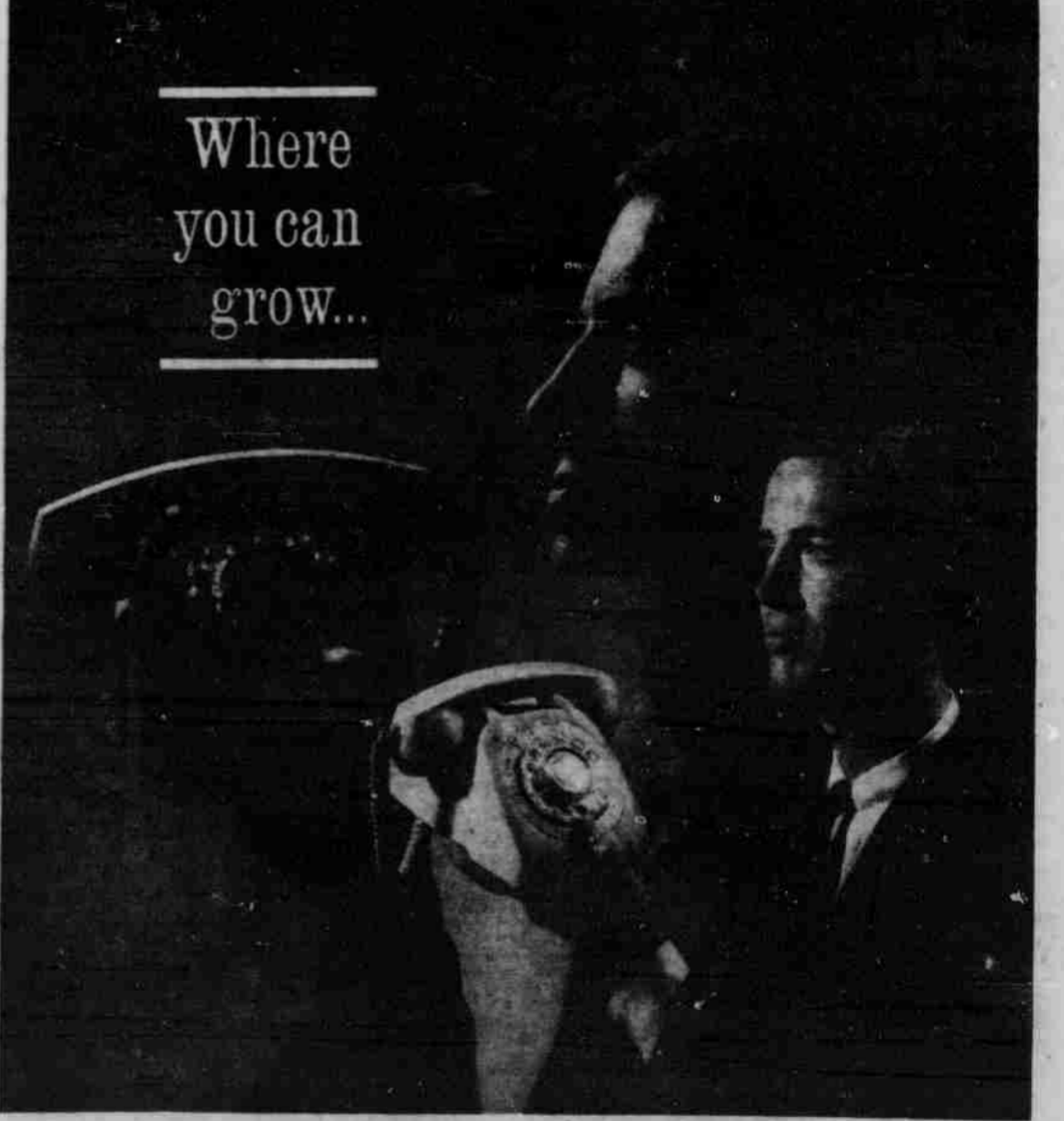
