Bush to Start 3 Sophs Against Lowly 'Hawks

Three sophomores will be in the starting lineup when Nebraska takes the floor against Kansas in a Big Eight basketball encounter at 8:05 p.m. tonight in the NU Coliseum. Husker Coach Jerry Bush indicated he would start sophs Bill Vincent, Denny Puelz and Charley Jones against the Jayhawks tonight. All three turned in good performances as the Scarlet downed Missouri, 65-63, in their last outing.

The three will combine with vets Ivan Grupe and Tom Russell as the starting five as Nebraska will attempt to stay solidly entrenched in the first division in the conference race with a win.

The Huskers are currently lon-C vs. Sigma Alpha Epsi-in fourth place in the Big lon-C or Delta Upsilon-C. 


