### In Conference Swim Meet

# Bauers Heads Husker Hopes

The Husker swimming team will compete in its inaugural meet when they enter the Big Eight swimming championships Thursday, Friday and Saturday at Ames, Ia., with a good chance of having its first individual championship since 1956.

Gene Cotter, a diver, was the last Nebraskan to win a conference title, but Coach Dick Klaas figures Vern Bauers has an excellent opportunity to bring home a first place ribbon in the 200-yard breaststroke this weekend.

Bauers, a junior from York, has paddled the event in 2:26.4, the best this season by a conference swimmer in a 25-yard pool. This clocking also lowered the Nebraska record .7 seconds.

In preparation for this meet the NU tankers competed in the AAU swimming meet last Sunday in which they broke seven records while taking five firsts and five seconds.

"We feel our relay team and Bauers are both capable of bettering their times this weekend," Klaas said. "Our best chances for points will come from Henry, Fosles, Swaim and Bauers, along with our two divers, Chuck Levy and Jay Smith."

"The last two years Colorado has nosed us out for fourth, but this year will be different," Klaas promised. The Husker coach figures on a fourth place finish for his swimmers with a chance of pushing Kansas for third.

Powers of Conference  
Iowa State and Oklahoma are expected to battle for

first, according to Klaas, with Oklahoma holding a slim edge. "Kansas will probably get third because they have more outstanding individuals than we do," he said. "Depth doesn't mean as much in the conference meet as it does in duals."

Bauers is leading the Husker swimmers in points scored in duals as Nebraska has compiled a 7-7 dual meet mark. Bauers has 85 1/2 points, followed by: Phil Swaim 77, Bill Henry 70 1/2, Bill Fowles 61 1/2, Kuni Mihara 58 1/2, Bill Wright 48 1/2, Chuck Levy 44 1/2, Dave Roberts 38 1/2, Jeff Amster 31 1/2, Larry Ferrell 23, Bob Mitchell 23, Smith 14, and Terry Anderson 12.

Mihara and Ferrell are the only two seniors on this year's squad and will serve as co-captains for the 13-man Husker swimming squad in the conference meet.

## Cagers Will Journey to Oklahoma

Coach Jerry Bush's basketball squad heads for Oklahoma this weekend for the final road trip of the campaign.

Saturday night the Huskers face Oklahoma State in Stillwater with both teams vying for fourth place in the Big Eight, each with 4-7 records. Monday night Oklahoma plays host to Nebraska in Norman.

Nebraska has nipped the Cowboys of Oklahoma State twice so far this season. The first time was at the Big Eight tournament in Kansas City, 52-51, and later in Lincoln, 57-56.

Coach Hank Iba's team is noted for its tight defense, continually moving offense and toughness on the home court.

The Huskers also beat Oklahoma at the buzzer in Lincoln, 57-56.

Tom Russell continues his domination of Husker statistics by leading in scoring (369), rebounds (182), free throws (131-168) and field goal percentage (.548).

The 6-7 senior needs only six more free throws to write his name in the record books for the fourth time. Herschell Turner scored 136 in the 1958-59 season.
