

# Cornhusker Nine Lose Three Game Set to Kansas

Nebraska's baseball team received a case of the shivers last weekend — from the chilly weather and three losses at the hands of Kansas.

The Jayhawkers, who finished last in the Big Eight standings last season, licked the Huskers in doubleheader Friday, 6-4 and 8-6, and in a single game Saturday afternoon, 3-2.

Saturday afternoon's tilt was a tough game to lose as the Huskers tried to return to their winning ways of the weekend before at Tulsa.

Kansas started the scoring in the first when Nebraska starter Ed Johnson, gave up a walk to Ken Hensley, Jayhawker rightfielder. Hensley moved to second when a sharp grounder bounced off Husker shortstop John Morris' glove.

Hensley Scores

Keith Abercrombie, KU's

leading hitter, brought Hensley home with a single.

The Jayhawkers continued the assault in the second as Don Miller singled and came home on winning pitcher Gerald Waldschmidt's long double.

Nebraska started to come back in the fourth. Steve Smith, NU's leftfielder, reached first on an error. After moving to second on a wild throw, Smith came home on first sacker Dick Becher's single.

Kansas picked up another run in the sixth as Dick Fanning smashed a double and came home on Jim Marshall's hit.

Smith and Becher combined once again in the NU sixth to close out the scoring. Smith boomed a triple to right-center. Becher promptly picked up his second RBI by bringing Smith home with a single.

At this point in the activi-

ties the Huskers had a definite rally on the move. Don Purcell followed Becher with a single putting Becher on second and Purcell on first with no one out.

But the alert Jayhawkers promptly squelched the threat. Catcher Abercrombie picked Becher off at second. Purcell stole second and went to third on an error,

but none of his mates could bring him home.

Pitcher Waldschmidt was very effective in his third win, striking out 11 Cornhuskers while walking only two. Johnson took the loss for Nebraska.

In the Friday doubleheader NU made several mental errors which proved costly. The first game, won by Kansas, 6-4, had little action until the sixth when KU jumped all over NU starter Ron Havekost for five runs.

The decisive blow was Abercrombie's three-run homer.

The bottom half of the sixth saw the Nebraskans push home three runs. NU filled the bases in the seventh but to no avail as the Huskers couldn't produce a run.

Wildness plagued starter Keith Sieck in the second game. Sieck gave Kansas six walks and five runs before being relieved by Ernie Bonistall in the fourth.

Nebraska went ahead of the Jayhawkers in the fifth as the Huskers batted around and scored five runs to take the lead, 6-5.

### Big Runs

But once again the Jayhawkers came up with the big runs. Kansas scored two in the sixth inning and one in the seventh to win, 8-6.

The series evened the Huskers' record at 3-3 (0-3 in the conference) and put KU at the head of the Big Eight with a 3-0 record.

Nebraska heads south for a three game series with Oklahoma this weekend.
