

Nearly New Shop Opens for Business

Offering items that all students can use at a very reduced price is the purpose of the Nearly New Shop said Mrs. Loren Bonneau, committee member of the Faculty Women.

The Nearly New Shop will open Wednesday from 7-9 p.m., and will be open every Wednesday throughout the year except on holidays. It is located at 1610 "R".

Students need only to have an I.D. and pay the small charge on the articles explained Mrs. Bonneau.

She stressed that they have a lot of furniture with such items as lamps, hampers, and tables being among the most numerous. They also have clothing of all types, drapes, kitchen items and dishes.

All items and help are volunteered by the Faculty Women.

All proceeds from the Shop are given to the Student Loan Fund. Mrs. Bonneau said that the government matches all money taken in in the ratio of 9:1. Last year the Faculty Women gave \$300 to the Fund and the government gave \$2,700.

Even skeletons are included in the University inventory? Heavens, yes! The University students, helping for the second year with the University inventory, must record ALL physical properties belonging to the University.

Harold Wallin of the inventory department, explained that the students are selected through application.

The purpose of the inventory is to verify and correct all records on the physical property of the University and bring it up to date, he continued.

In previous years, forms were sent to department heads and they took the inventory. Wallin explained that because of the great amount of property concerned it was difficult for the department heads to make a complete inventory. They also did not have the time.

Jim Applegate, one of the student inventory assistants said that you find places you never knew existed or have never heard of before. Applegate plans to spend about eight hours a week on the job.

Wallin said that the job of taking inventory is a never-ending process because as soon as one cycle is finished, it is time to start all over again. It takes from 1 1/2 to 2 years to complete an inventory.

All physical property has to be reported to the Legislature each year.

The students apply stickers with numbers on them which aid in taking the inventory and to correct any previous errors.

Expendable items such as the TV tubes of the college television station are not recorded Wallin said.

Other items on the inventory list include: tables, chairs, table and chair carts, and scientific equipment.

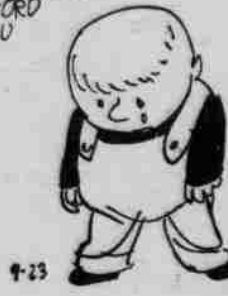
