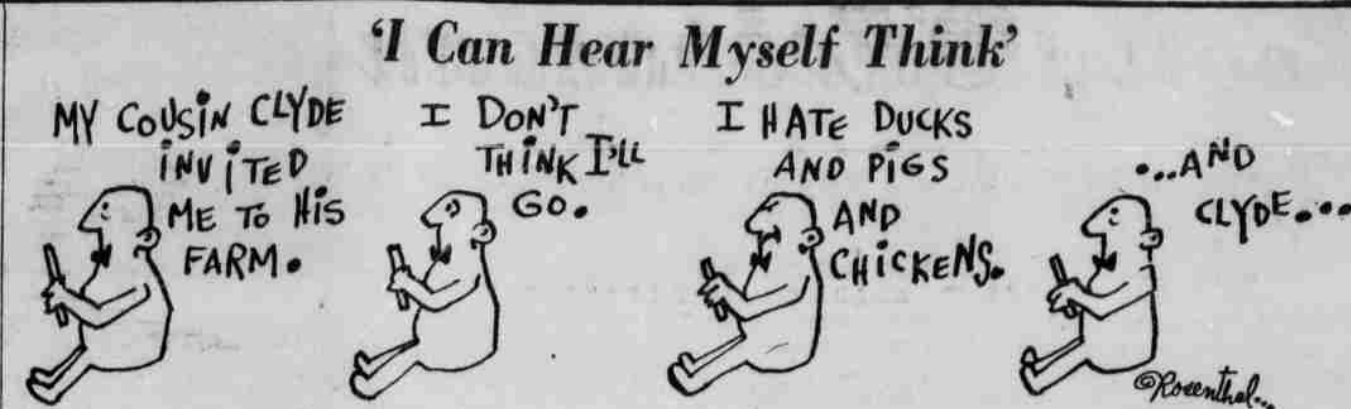

Monday is the deadline for Nebraska high schools to submit names of students qualified for the 1962-63 University of Nebraska Regents Examination, Nov. 7.

Dr. Aubrey Forrest, director of scholarships and financial aids, said that 5,300 seniors were expected to take the exam. The students, in the upper third of their classes at some 450 Nebraska high schools, will be competing for 325 freshman Regents Scholarships awarded on the basis of exam scores.
