## YD's Hear Challenge By Governor

Gov. Frank B. Morrison, speaking at the Thursday night meeting of the University Young Democrats, expressed a firm determination "to lead the state positively."

"The students of this state must take the challenge of today and aim toward moral responsibility and the search for truth," he said.

Questioning the audience, Morrison asked, "Is anything more important than an attempt to placate the misunderstanding that exists in the world today?"

"I have seen the Berlin Wall with my own eyes," he commented. "Often students ask 'What can we do about it?'"

"My only comment to them is that we can't actually do much about the wall," Morrison explained. "But we can prevent the erection of prejudice and ignorance within our own country," Morrison postulated.

Concluding, Morrison stressed, "The University of Nebraska will grow greater as the dedication of its students grows."

## G.I. Forum Establishes Award for Writers

Funds allowing a permanent and continuous award for student writing in the Spanish language has been granted to the University.

Dr. Charles Colman, chairman of the department of romance languages, said the American G.I. Forum will make a \$75 award each year to the undergraduate student who submits the best essay in Spanish.

The American G. I. Forum is a national and local association made up primarily of veterans promoting better understanding of Spanish culture and language in the United States.

Ezekiel P. Gandara and Manuel Valverde, both of

Lincoln, presented the check to the University Foundation in behalf of the local chapter of the American G. I. Forum.

Dr. Roberto Esquenazi-Mayo, associate professor of romance languages, will make a personal award of \$25 to the second place student in 1963.

The contest is open to any undergraduate student whose native language is not Spanish, regardless of major or college. The essay must be from 1,000 to 1,200 words and must be on Inter-American affairs or friendship. Entries must be in the hands of Professor Esquenazi not later than March 1.

The winners will be announced each year on April 14, Pan-American Day.
