

'Opposites' Take to Turf Saturday Golfers Beat Creighton

Saturday's meeting between North Carolina State and Nebraska, the first time the Huskers have faced the Wolfpacks, at 2 p.m. in Memorial Stadium, should prove to be a game of opposites.

The Huskers, ranked ninth in the country on offense, will

face one of the toughest defensive clubs around this season.

In the Wolfpack's game last Saturday against Maryland, North Carolina State held the Terps to only 92 yards on the ground before losing, 14-6.

A 78-yard punt return was the Wolfpack downfall.

North Carolina State has failed to score in the first half of any of its three ball games whereas the first half was the Huskers' strongest half, scoring four touchdowns against Iowa State last week.

"It is like jumping from the frying pan into the fire," proberbed Coach Earle Edwards whose squad has dropped two of its three games.

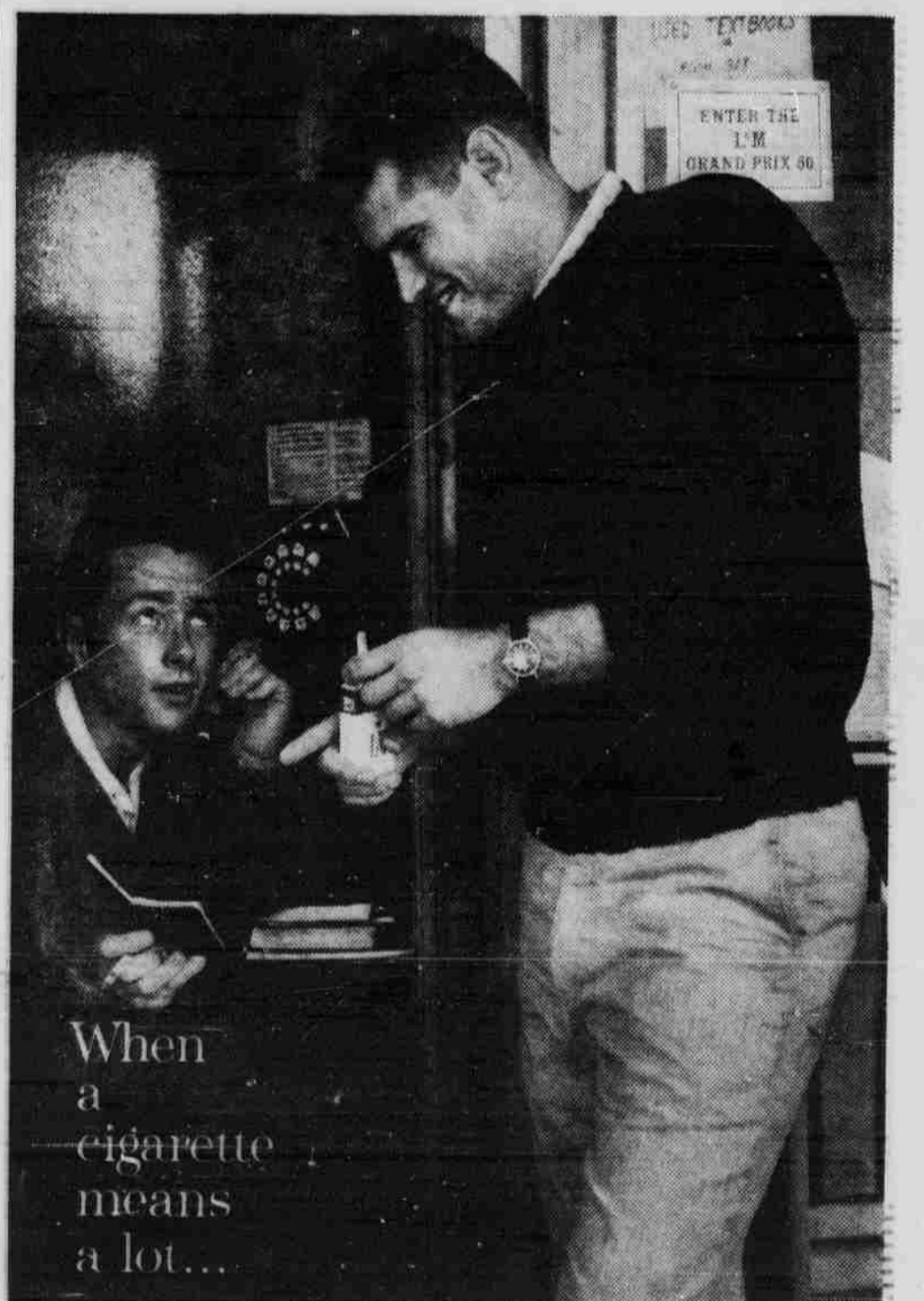
