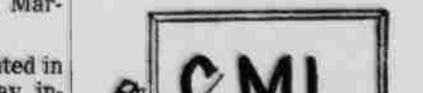
Attorneys Flavel Wright and F. C. Radke will discuss the merit plan for judges with Mrs. Wallace Peterson serving as moderator.
