

Ex-NU Star Returns for Mizzou Tilt

Nebraska's Homecoming this year means something very special to Lt. Colonel H. Sam Francis, an All-American fullback for the Scarlet and Cream in 1936.

Saturday's game with Missouri will be the first Cornhusker football game Col. Francis has seen since he graduated from the University in 1937.

Because Col. Francis has devoted his life to the service of the country as an officer in the United States Army, and because his tours of duty have taken him to foreign lands such as Panama, Vietnam, Germany and the Philippines, he has not been in this area during football seasons to be able to see the Huskers play.

Col. Francis arrived in Lincoln yesterday for his personal Homecoming weekend, which includes a reunion with some of the members of the 1936 Huskers team at the University Club Friday noon.

"Glad To Be Back"

"I am looking forward to this game with boyish excitement," Col. Francis said. "After you have been away from a place you like for 25 years, you are always glad to be back."

"I want to see Nebraska beat Missouri," said Col. Francis. "I have never seen a Nebraska team lose to Missouri—maybe that is a good sign."

"I want to hear those Cornhusker songs again," he said. "I am anxious to meet Nebraska Athletic Director Tippey Dye again," Col. Francis said. "He is doing such a good job here at Nebraska."

"I have not seen him since 1937, when we played for the College All-Stars against the Green Bay Packers in Chicago's Soldier Field, Col. Francis said. "We were the first All-Star team in the series to beat the pros."

Sam Francis first came to the University from Oberlin, Kans., beginning his career as a Cornhusker in 1934.

Fullback Francis became All-American Francis in 1936.

Big Six Tidbit

The '36 Nebraska team was the Big Six Champion with a 7-2 record, losing only to the perennial non-conference powers Minnesota and Pittsburgh. This was the last Cornhusker team to be coached by D. X. Bible.

The one game which best exemplified Francis' value to the team was the Oct. 17, 1936 game with Indiana played in Lincoln.

Francis had injured an ankle the week before, and D. X. Bible did not want to use him that week against Indiana.

The first half Nebraska played without Francis, and at the intermission, Nebraska was losing, 9-0.

In the second half Nebraska played with Francis, and led by Francis, the Huskers defeated the Hoosiers, 13-9.

The last time Sam Francis saw the Tigers take the field against the Scarlet and Cream—he was a member of the 1936 Husker team that beat Missouri, 20-0. Does the return of Col. Sam Francis herald a happy Husker Homecoming?

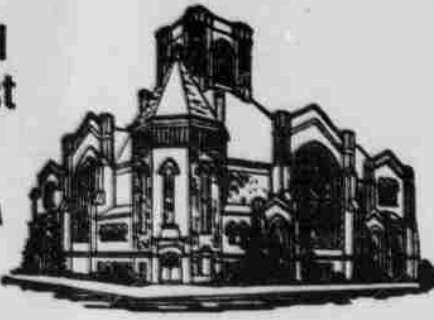

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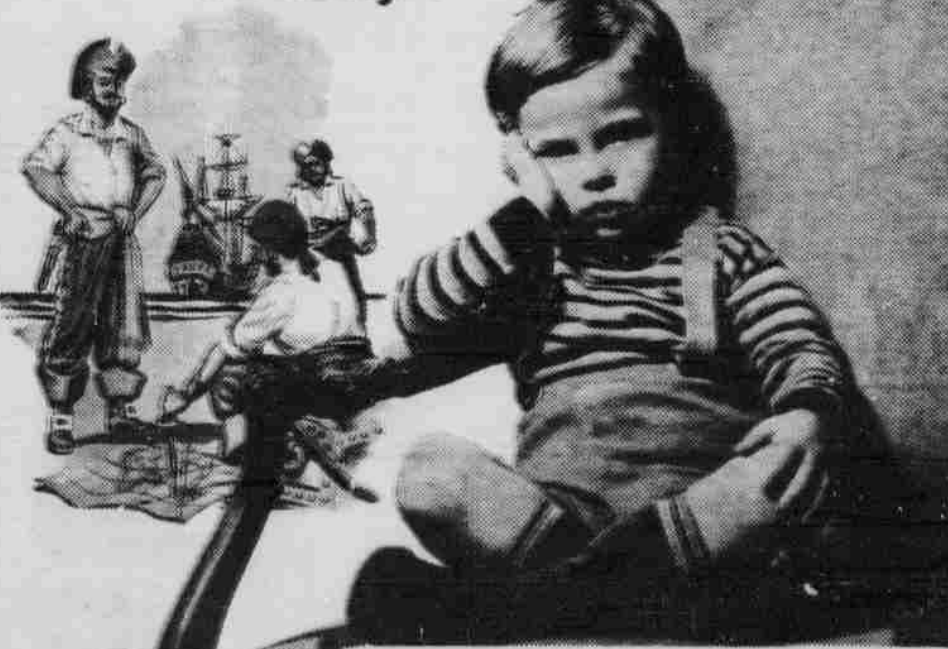
