



"All employees of institutions for the mentally retarded are really potential therapists, and that includes the Glenwood and Woodland sity. State Schools in Iowa.

Dr. Peffer was the keynote speaker this week at the first informational conference on dynamic health at the Uni-

He said that the most important informational work now needs to be done with employees of the institution, as well as the general pub-

lic and relatives.
"The staff and all employees must really believe in the efficiency of treatment or training, and must be enthu-siastic," he said. "It is well known in this business that most employees' problems fall within the category of social incompetence rather than work incompetence," he

Dr. Peffer said there has been far too little understanding of the problems of employees in mental hospitals and retarded institutions.

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
