

Carlson Repeats As 'Star'

Dwain Carlson, Husker captain who led Nebraska to the finest football season in 22 years, is the Nebraskan's 'Star of the Week' for his performance in Saturday's 34-6 loss to Oklahoma. Carlson, 6-1, 210 pound right guard, used his speed and agility to hamper Sooner backs the entire afternoon displaying one of his finest performances of the season in the Husker defeat to earn his second 'Star' award this year. "They didn't outman us; they outsmarted us," Carlson commented looking back on the OU fracas. "They weren't the best team we've met, I thought Missouri was better," the Husker lineman continued. Nebraska gave up its only other loss to Missouri earlier in the season.

Looking back on the successful NU season Carlson commented, "The season went so fast when we were winning I didn't really stop to think about it. I knew we were going to have a winning season but I didn't think an 8-2, rather a 7-3," the Husker co-captain continued.

Carlson had praise for the Nebraska players stating, "there were a lot of guys who didn't play last year but knew they would be this year and really worked hard." Carlson felt the season success was such a team effort

that he preferred not to point out individual players.

Coaches
"The coaches had such a positive attitude and faith in us it made us feel like winning," Carlson commented on Bob Devaney and his staff. "Things were so different from last year," Carlson continued, "there was more respect for the coaches than last year. You can't help but respect them (NU coaching staff)."

Carlson also had praise for the Husker coaches' organization and amount of work they put into planning and eliminating mental errors. "We didn't have to hit all week to find out who was going to play on Saturday," the Nebraskan 'Star' stated giving the coaches credit for the better practices the Husker squad enjoyed this year.

Eying the Husker future Carlson asserted, "the frosh is the best I've seen, next years linemen should be good although there could be some lack of depth," he continued.

As for his own future, Carlson was a bit uncertain. "Some of the coaches have been trying to get me into pro ball but I'm not sure I have the size," Carlson commented. The Husker lineman plans to wait to see how he performs in the bowl games before making a final decision. Carlson will play in the Blue-Gray game in Mobile, Alabama on Dec. 29th and the Challenge Bowl in Corpus Christi, Texas on Jan. 5th. Carlson is a senior in Business Administration and a Fullerton High graduate.

Three Seniors In Texas Bowl

Three Grapplers Return

Only three lettermen return to Coach Bob Mancusco's wrestling team this year which opens its season in Terre Haute, Ind., Saturday.

Last year's team finished with a 9-2-1 record in dual meets and finished fourth in the Big Eight meet and ninth in the N.C.A.A. meet.

But on that squad were the likes of Dave Cook, Jim Faimon, Gordon Chipman, Dan Hoevert, Harold Thompson and Jim Raschke.

Thompson and Raschke were undefeated in dual competition last season and also won their divisions in the Big Eight tournament.

Returning lettermen include Dick Vansickel, 130 pounds; Den Fox, 177 pounder and Mike Nissen, 123 pounds.

Nissen will captain the squad and will be trying for his third season of dual competition without a loss. He suffered two losses last year — one in the finals of the Big Eight meet and the other in the semi-finals of the N.C.A.A.

Much of the grappler hopes are riding on Mike this season as this year's squad will be young and inexperienced, but Coach Mancusco feels some seasoning three sophomore prospects may develop as the year progresses.

All three are former Nebraska State High School champs. They are Steve Walenz, 117 pounds; Charles Clatterback, 147 pounder and Mike Tillotson, 167 pounds.
