

Wildcats To Host Saturday Big Obstacle Set for NU

Nebraska cage teams will carry a 5-7 season mark into their second Big Eight outing when they travel to Manhattan Wildcat team.

The Huskers have not won on the Manhattan courts since 1943 when the Scarlet posted a 41-32 win under the late coach A. J. Lewandowski.

The Wildcats finished second to Kansas in the holiday Big Eight tournament in Kansas City losing to the Jayhawks in the fourth overtime. The 'Cats post a 5-6 season mark with many of their setbacks coming from powerful non-conference foes.

The last Husker win over K-State was in 1960 when Nebraska notched a 70-60 upset over the Wildcats at Lincoln. The overall series stands at 59 wins for Kansas State compared to 44 for the Huskers.

Nebraska will go into the game fresh from a 75-47 setback by Colorado Monday night. This will be the second Big Eight appearance for the Huskers and the first for the Wildcats.

The Staters stopped Air Force Academy Monday night 58-42. Roger Suttner, 7-foot center, proved to be the big gun against the Falcons as he hit 18 points, nine of them in a second half surge in 12 minutes.

Nebraska will face Suttner, Willie Murrell, junior college transfer and Gary Marriott in the K-State front line. Coach Tex Winter may start two Nebraskans, as he did against Air Force at guards. Al Peithman of Hebron and Jerry Johnson of North Platte received starting nods against the Falcons.

Coach Jerry Bush will counter with Ivan Grupe and Charlie Jones at forwards, Bill Vincent at center; Earl Wright and Daryl Petsch, leading Husker scorer, will start at guards.

Vincent's 15 points against Colorado moved the 6-7 Husker junior into third place among Nebraskan scorers. Petsch still holds the reins on the scoring lead with 176 points in 12 games for a 14.7 average.

D. Petsch Week's 'Star' After Big Eight Tourney

Daryl Petsch, 6-5, 210 pound Husker cager has been selected as the Nebraskan 'Star of the Week' for his efforts in the Big Eight tournament in Kansas City during vacation.

The junior letterman from Marysville, Kansas, ranked sixth in scoring in the tourney with 53 points in three games. Petsch, who is the top Husker scorer this year, suffered a poor evening and team showing last Monday night as the Scarlet took a 75-47 drub-

bing at the hands of Colorado. The star forward-guard described the Kansas City Big Eight tourney as "good, especially the final game with which saw Kansas and K-State battling through four overtimes."

Eying the Big Eight, Petsch found the teams to be weaker with the squads showing more balance than last year.

Commenting on his versatile role as forward and guard the Nebraskan 'star' stated, "I would rather play forward

because I'm more used to it. When I play forward I have a little more speed opposed to playing against the smaller, faster guys."

Looking to the Husker future in the hardwood sport Petsch felt that Nebraska should be better than this year. "We only lose one man (Ivan Grupe) and we have some very good freshmen," Petsch pointed out.

Petsch earned All-State honors at Kansas his senior year while his team took the State Class-A championship. Daryl's best performances were in the Oklahoma and Oklahoma State games in which he scored 18 and 24 points, respectively. In the Ok. State game Petsch sunk the winning basket with three seconds left in the game.

Petsch described Nolan Ellison of Kansas University as the best player he has faced.
