

Thinclads Defeat Houston In Dual

Nebraska tracksters topped Houston 82-36 in a dual meet in Memorial Stadium yesterday afternoon as both teams prepared for the Drake Relays this weekend in Des Moines, I.

Six meet records tumbled and one stadium record was set during the afternoon as a small crowd of spectators watched.

One of the most stunning performances came in the 440-yard run as Husker Gil Gebo spun the event in a record shattering :38.0. Gebo topped teammate Dick Strand in erasing the old mark of :48.6 set by Danny Frey of Houston in 1960.

The 880-yard run provided

some thrills for the crowd even though it was not a record-breaking performance. Husker co-captain Mike Fleming nipped teammate Ray Stevens at the tape. Fleming was caught in 1:54.3. Laurie Elliott of Houston was third.

The four-lap relay won by Nebraska was also a crowd pleaser. Anchor Stevens overtook Houston's Wayne Clevon on the final turn to bring home the victory in 3:18.5. Mauro Altizio, Clarence Scott and Jim Wendt were the other members of the winning NU relay team.

Scarlet speedster Ray Knaub spun the 100-yard dash in :9.8 and the 220-yard event in :21.7 for two new marks. The old century record of :09.9 was held jointly by Andy Anderson and Allan Cassell of Houston. Cassell also held the 220 record at :21.9.

The other meet record was set by Harry Krebs and Jack Cramer, both of Nebraska. Both cleared 6-4, both Krebs was credited with the victory because of fewer misses. Ken

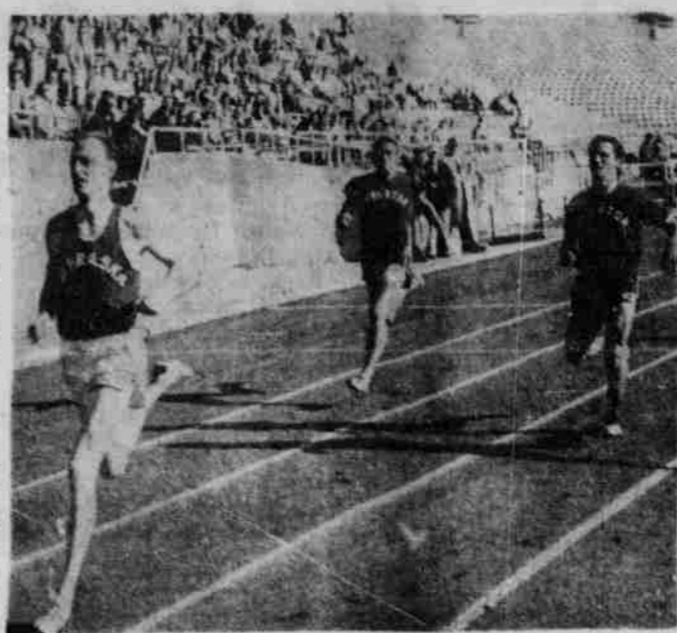

Cook of Nebraska was third at 5-10.

Jamaican Victor Brooks won the broad jump for the Huskers with a leap of 23-11. Juris Jesifers placed second in the event with a 21-10½. AND Timmons of Houston was third with a 21-1½ mark.

Jesifers won the pole vault with a mark of 13-1½.

K-State, at their turn, scored 67 of the required 71 runs after six outs. However, due to the fielding and bowling (pitching) by Dennis Keyvill (six dismissals) and Bader Basrai (four dismissals) the remaining four outs were obtained without any additional Kansas scoring, leading to a narrow Nebraska victory.

PTP team manager Hem Tiphis called the game "a thriller." He congratulated the players for their behaviour and added that he expects a better average in the coming game against the RAF.
