CAMPUS

COLORADO'S TRACK TEAM upset the Huskers thinclads at Boulder despite a fine performance by Nebraska's Ray Knaub. The Buffs edged the Huskers 8 1/2 to 60. Knaub covered the 100 in 9:5 and pushed Colorado's Dick Burns to a record 20:8 2/10.

ERRORS HELD NEBRASKA to one victory in three game series against Colorado. The Huskers are presently 5-9 in the conference and has dipped to sixth place. Husky Dave May is the only Nebraskan above the .300 mark with a .375 batting percentage.

BOB DEVANEY'S GRID SQUAD moved through a brisk week of practice in search of depth. Several freshmen stood out during the practices. Quarterback Fred Duda was promoted to second team status and performed well. Second string tackles Monte Kiffin and Bob Jones continued their play making the tackle spot the strongest line position on the team.

BIG EIGHT

MISSOURI'S BASEBALL TEAM claimed Big Eight honors by taking the league lead from Oklahoma in a three game series and retained its number one position in the nation, edging Oregon by two votes in the national poll.

KANSAS FOOTBALL HOPES took a plunge when senior quarterback Brian Palmer quit the team. Palmer said that he was discouraged because he never got to play, running just 12 plays in an intrasquad game last week. Said Jack Mitchell, KU coach, "We hate to see him quit. We had four good quarterbacks but now we have only three for next fall and we may not have that many by then."

Thinclads Prime For Big 8 Clash In All-Sports Day Dual With MU

Two of the top teams in the conference — Nebraska and Missouri — will battle it out on the track Saturday in All Sports Day competition. The meet will start at 1 p.m. in Memorial Stadium. This will be the first meeting between the two teams since 1954.

In the Indoor Championships, Nebraska finished first with Missouri in second place.

Many records will fall this weekend. Two of the oldest marks could be topped by Huskers Ray Knaub and Gil Gebo. The 100-yard dash record is :09.6 set by Roland Locke of NU in 1926. This year Knaub has run :09.5 in the century.

In the 220-yard dash Locke set the standard at :20.5 in 1926. Knaub ran this time last year and has the potential to repeat his performance.

Gebo who holds a searing :47.6 quarter could demolish the old mark of :48.3 held by Gene Littler of NU and Bob Schuster of MU.

Nebraska will be hoping to stage a comeback after losing to Colorado in a triangular at Boulder last weekend.

Ricky Beldner of Missouri who won the 60-yard dash over Kent McCloughan of Nebraska and Knaub will be hoping to accomplish the same feat again, but he might have some trouble.

Husker co-captain Fred Wilke will be pitted against Tiger Jim Streeby in both hurdle events. Wilke pushed Colorado's Jim Miller to a new record at :14.2 in the highs last week and could turn in a comparable time this Saturday.

Missouri's Greg Pelster will be a big threat in the 880-yard run. He won the 600 and 880-yard races in the indoor conference meet in March. Nebraska will counter with Bill Kenny and probably John Portee.

Husker co-captain Mike Fleming will be entered in the mile along with teammate Ray Stevens. Both have run faster than the 4:18.8 dual record set in 1952 by Lee Moore of Nebraska.

In addition to the traditional fare, the fans will see the 440-yard relay, the three-mile run and the 330-yard intermediate hurdles which Wilke will run.

These events have been added to the Big Eight program to lay the groundwork for preparation of track men for the U.S. 1964 Olympic team.

The new addition in the field events is the hop, step and jump which Victor Brooks of Nebraska had had experience. He leaped 47-9 at

Colorado being barely edged by Buff Leander Durley who got 47-10 3/4. Brooks also competed in this event in the British Empire Games in Australia last year.

Brooks will also be the main Husker entry in the broad jump. He has jumped 23-10 several times this year. Nebraska will also go with Juris Jesifers.

Jesifers will be entered in the pole vault along with Jim Pile. Missouri will counter with Bill Younger who cleared the bar at 14-4 at Kansas City.

In the shot put Nebraska has Roland Johnson who will meet Tiger Bob Neuman who has thrown the shot better than 52-5. Johnson will also compete in the discus for the Huskers.

In the high jump Nebraska's Harry Krebs and Jack Cramer who have both cleared over 6-4 will be up against Ross Tunnel who got second in the indoor meet with a 6-6 3/4 mark.

Nebraska will go with Milan Van Newkirk in the javelin. He has a toss of nearly 160 feet.

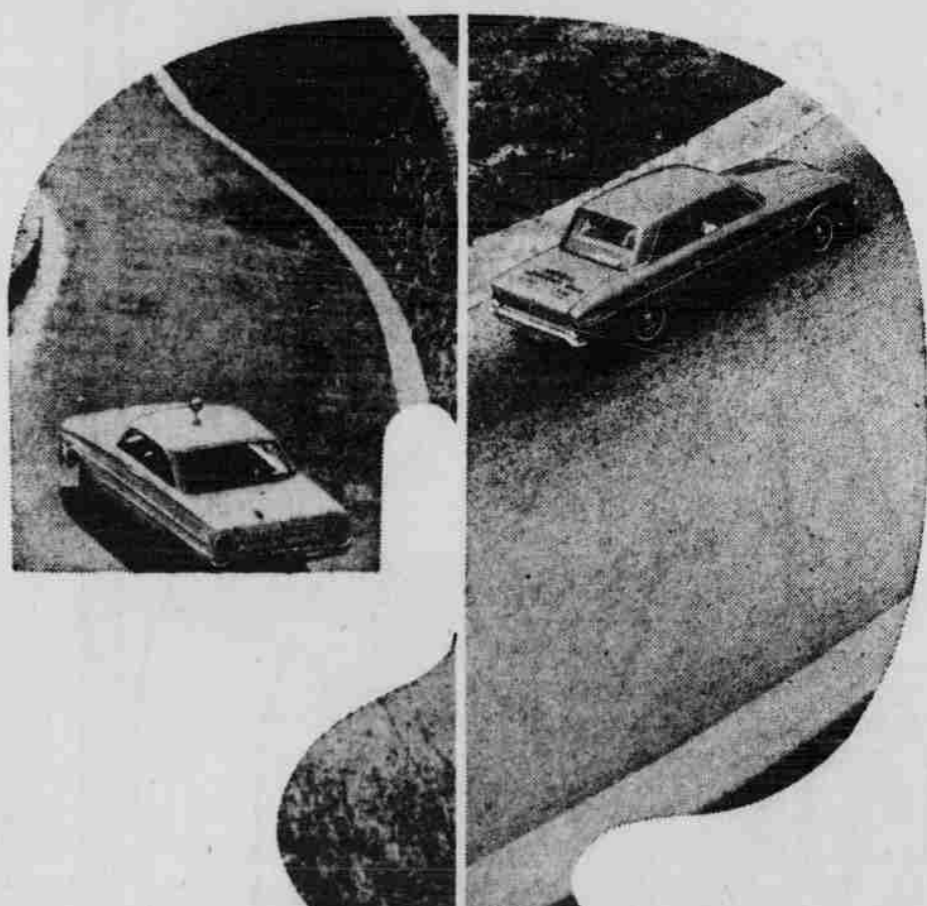
