Injuries Force Seniors From Husker Backfield

With seniors Dennis Clardige and Rudy Johnson out with injuries and halfback Willie Ross still hampered somewhat by an injured shoulder, Nebraska sends a backfield of three juniors and a sophomore against Oklahoma State tomorrow at Lewis Field, Stillwater, at 1:30. Sophomore Fred Duda will be Nebraska's starting quarterback for the third time this season. In his previous two starts, Nebraska mauled Kansas State 28 to 6 and Kansas 23 to 9.

At 186 pounds, starter Maynard Smidt of Cozad (left halfback) is Nebraska's heaviest backfield man. Bob Hohn will play right halfback, and Bruce Smith will play fullback.

Nebraska goes for its second victory against Oklahoma State after its first win last year, 14 to 0 in Lincoln. Joining the conference in 1960, the Cowboys won the first two encounters.

Despite the small backfield, Nebraska outweighs Oklahoma State 225 to 197 in the line and 234 to 201 tackle-to-tackle. The Cowboy backfield averages 186 pounds per man to 179 for the Huskers.

Besides playing without Clardige, who has a severe thigh

Cowboy quarterback Mike Miller, who completed barely 25% of his passes in the first five games (all losses as Oklahoma State scored only 20 points), now has completed 37 of 79 for a 46.8% season's completion percentage. Rushing is led by fullbacks George Thomas and Walt Garrison. Despite never carrying the ball on the freshman team last year, Garrison gained 138 yards last Saturday in the 33 to 24 win over Tulsa University.

charley horse, and Johnson, Nebraska's leading ground gainer and scorer (523 yards in 80 carries and 44 points), the Huskers will also miss tackle Monte Kiffin, who has been injured for three weeks now.

Despite scoring 61 points in the last two games, largely because of quarterback Mike Miller, the Cowboys, who have lost all four of their conference games, are definite underdogs to the league-leading (5 and 0) Cornhuskers. Nebraska still leads the nation in rushing offense (278 yards per game) and is fourth in total offense.

NU Frosh To Protect Win Mark

Nebraska's freshmen football Coach John Melton and his team will both put undefeated records on the line against Iowa State's defense-minded frosh Friday at 2:00 p.m. in Memorial Stadium.

The Cyclones invade Lincoln with a 14 to 0 victory over Missouri under their belts. The Husker yearlings, who tromped lighter Kansas State 43 to 22, will attempt to maintain the three game streak started by last year's team and make Melton's mark four for four since taking the Scarlet frosh job.

Husker weight advantage will be evidenced against the Cyclones 198 in the line—giving up 16 pounds per man to the Huskers. A light line didn't hamper the first year Cyclones who beat their Tiger counterparts in Ames by more than the score indicates.

Missouri, supposedly boasting the best frosh squad during Dan Devine's Columbia tenure, managed only 24 yards on the ground against the tough Iowans.

Quarterbacks Ron Halda and Kip Koski offer a passing threat that Melton can brood about. The two Cyclones pitched for 203 yards against Missouri.

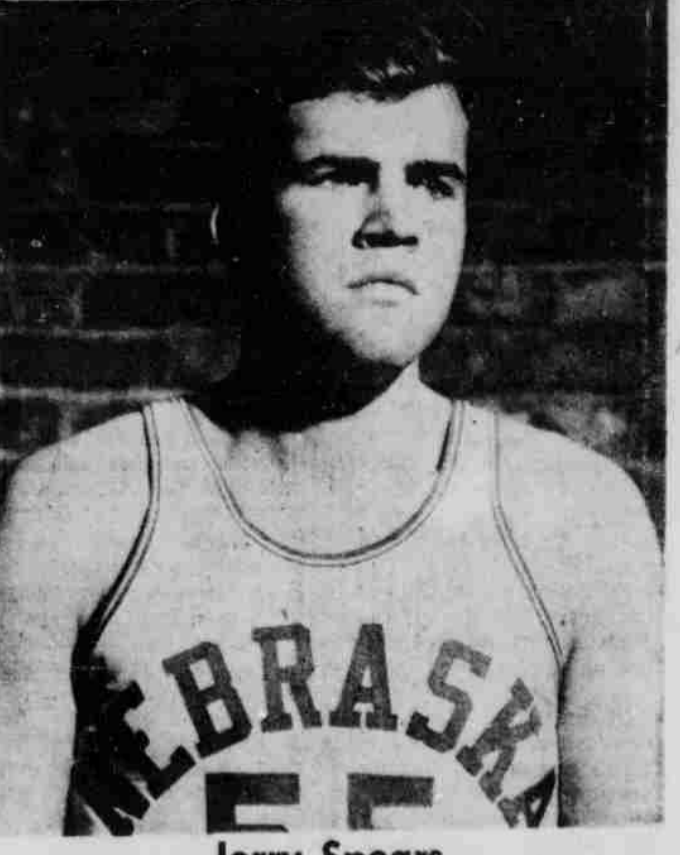
Definitely out for the Huskers due to injury are Steve Gunther, 190-pound quarterback from LeMars, Iowa, and Tom Smith, 188-pound end from Hastings. Listed as doubtful is 229-pound guard Harry Meagher of Steubenville, Ohio.
