Murrell showed the most at Kansas City, however. He scored 30 against Nebraska in the opening game, 27 against Missouri in the semifinal before tapering off to 16 in the finals. That's 73 if you add it up.

But as a enjoyer of good defensive basketbal, Mur-

rell's effort in the finals took the prize.

Coach Tex Winter had his boys in a zone with Murrell the deep man under the basket. That's where James King of the Cowboys sets up on offense, and he's their top

To make a long story short, King got off no shots in the first half and just four in the second, mainly because Murrell was right with him, Kansas State beat Oklahoma State at its own game - defense.


