A two year curriculum in dental hygiene will be offered by the University in its College of Dentistry beginning in the fall of 1964. This curriculum will be designed to edu-

cate dental hygienists and to qualify them for practice in accordance with state laws governing the practice of dental hygiene.

### Chess Club Reorganizes, Holds Meet

The Union-sponsored Chess Club will be reorganized, according to James Hornby, Union games manager.

With this change, the club will be under the Union games department. This is being done because of the cramped space for players. According to Hornby, it is hoped that the games department can obtain definite Union rooms to be used by the club whenever they need them.

Right now the Chess Club is conducting the Campus Chess Tournament, in which 18 players are participating.

These 18 will be narrowed down to 6 for the final tournament. The top four players will form the University of Nebraska Chess Team that will take part in the Regional Face-to-Face Tournament in Iowa City, Iowa, Feb. 14 and 15.

According to Hornby, the club has some of the best chess players in the country as rated by the United States Chess Federation.

Dental hygienists are licensed to practice, under the supervision of dentists, in dental offices and in public institutions such as schools, hospitals, public health clinics and industrial clinics. Dental hygienists inspect the teeth and gums for signs of disease and disorder and chart their findings for the dentists.

The services of dental hygienists are of great value to patients in the maintenance of mouth health and the prevention of dental diseases.

The two-year curriculum leads to a certificate in dental hygiene and qualifies the candidate for examination by the National Board of Dental Examiners and the State Boards of Dental Examiners in all states. Upon successful completion of a state board examination, the dental hygienist receives a license to practice according to the laws of the respective state.

In addition to the two-year curriculum, the University of Nebraska will offer a four-year curriculum, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene.

Two years of directed study in the College of Arts and

Sciences, in addition to the dental hygiene curriculum, will be required to complete requirements for this degree.

Before admission, the applicant is required to have an interview with the Chairman of the Department of Dental Hygiene or, if the applicant lives at some distance from the University, with a representative designated by the Chairman.

Applicants who are currently enrolled in the University of Nebraska need complete only the application form for the Department of Dental Hygiene and return it to the Department of Dental Hygiene, Andrews Hall 214.
