Claridge climaxed a three year career by directing the Nebraska squad to a 13-7 Orange Bowl win over Auburn on New Year's Day.

During his three years he set a new passing record with 1,733 yards via the airways. His three year yardage gain totaled 2,357. Claridge passed for 17 touchdowns and ran for eight more.

With Claridge's signing, the Husker football team may have set still another record. No less than ten players from the 1963 Big Eight Championship team have signed professional contracts.

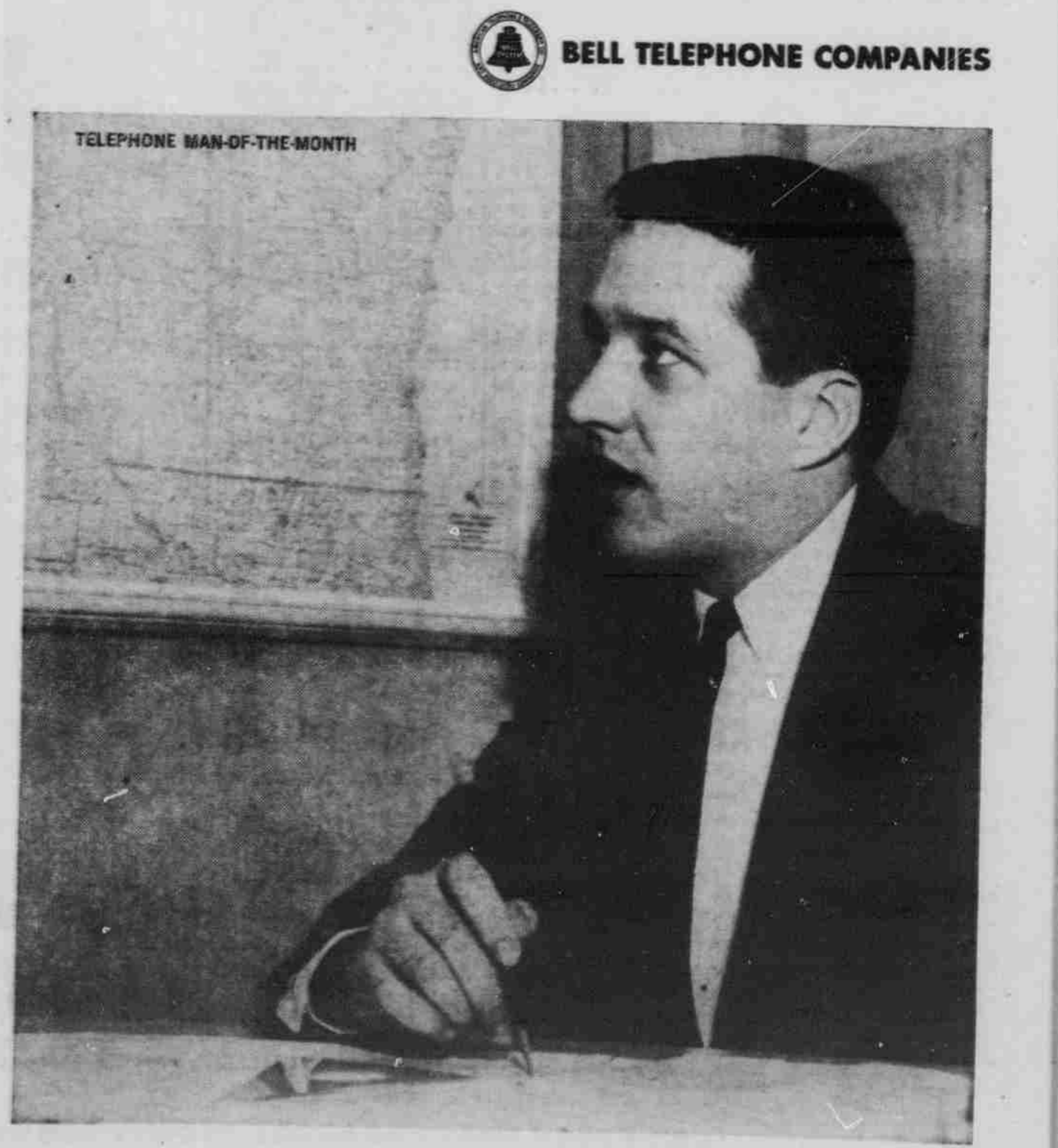
