OSU Cops Mat Crown As Huskers Finish 7th

Favored Iowa State fell by the wayside as the defending champions, Oklahoma State scored a record 103 points to win the Big Eight Wrestling Championship. Iowa State managed 79 points, Colorado 55, Oklahoma 42, Kansas State 16, Nebraska 6 and Kansas 4.

The strong Oklahoma State team had all ten wrestlers in the finals with five ending up champions.

The Outstanding Wrestler Trophy was awarded to Gordon Hassman of Iowa State, a 157-pounder. His running-mate at 167, Tom Peckham, received the Most Falls Trophy. Over 7,500 fans attended the finals show on Saturday night.

Nebraska lost all men but one in Friday's preliminary matches. John Hallgreen, 157-pounder, pinned Gary Shumake of Kansas in 5:12. In the semi-finals, Hallgreen was dropped by Hassman in 5:48. In the consolation brackets, the Huskers also fared poorly, advancing only Phil McCaffrey, who pinned Phil Doughty of Kansas to move to the finals of the consolation bracket. McCaffrey finished fourth in the 167-pound class to Mick DeRock of Colorado, 6-1, for the only Nebraska place.

Gary Richards, 137-pound

grappler provided one of the best Husker matches when he came close to upsetting Iowa State's number-one ranked Bob Buzzard. Buzzard won 2-0 on a reversal late in the third and final period.

Then winner's trophy won by the Cowboy's marked the fourth straight Oklahoma State conference title. Coach Myron Roderick's matmen will now go into the National tourney as favorites to pick up the first place trophy there.

Four University of Nebraska track freshmen made a good showing at the Kansas State Indoor Relays on Saturday night.

Charles Greene, Tom Millsap, Jim Ryan and Lowell Stratton participated in the Freshman and Junior College division at the annual event in Manhattan.

In the 75-yard dash, Greene and Millsap finished first and second, tying the meet and field house record of .07.3 seconds held by Roger Sayers of Omaha University who also

ran :07.3 in the University division Saturday night.

Jim Ryan, frosh middle distance ace from New York City, finished second in the 600 yard run in a close finish with a time of 1:14.3.

Placing second in the mile run with a time of 4:21.3 was Lowell Stratton, freshman distance man from Gering. The winning time was 4:19.7.

These four freshmen give a bright outlook to Frank Sevine's track picture at the University for the next three years.

Gym Team Wins Crown

Nebraska swept to an easy victory in the first annual Big Eight Conference gymnastics meet at Ames Saturday. The Huskers amassed 203.5 points, followed by Iowa State with 154.5 points.

Dennis Albers of Nebraska won five events in the meet.

Albers took first place in the all-around, side horse, long horse, tumbling and floor exercise. Husker Francis Allen won the parallel bars.

Colorado won two events, the high bar and the still rings, finishing third in the

meet with 129 points. Kansas scored 13 points followed by Kansas State with 4 points.

Nebraska has now won two Big Eight Conference championships. The Huskers were declared Big Eight champions last year on a basis of dual meet performances.

Nebraska used only six gymnasts in the conference meet Saturday. Each team was allowed a squad of ten. The Huskers relied upon depth rather than number to win the Conference championship. Gymnastics coach Jake Geier can add the only two

Big Eight Conference championships awarded in the Big Eight to his other long string of victories. Geier's teams have also won six Midwest AAU championships, seven All-College championships, one Central District championship, one Northwest championship.

Tankers: Future Is Promising

Nebraska finished only third in the Big Eight Swimming Championships last weekend, but Husker underclassmen let it be known they will be in the middle of the scrap next season.

Nine sophomores and juniors set new Nebraska varsity records in the conference meet, and two cracked Big Eight standards.

The squad's two seniors also got in on the record smashing. Bill Henry drubbed the Big Eight and NU varsity record in the 100-yard backstroke with a :56.4 clocking and drowned the old Cornhusker record in the 200-yard backstroke with 2:07.1. Bill Fowles cracked the varsity 100-yard butterfly record with a :56.1.

Junior Keefe Ludwig led the underclass onslaught on records. The freestyle specialist set conference and varsity marks in the 50 with a :22.2 clocking and in the 100 he set another varsity mark, swimming the distance in :48.9.

Mike Jackson, only a soph, smashed the Big Eight record in the 200-yard butterfly with a 2:20.7, but was disqualified on a faulty turn. Another Husker, junior Charlie Flansburg won the event in 2:23.3, his career best.
