

NU Black Shirts Boost Husker Total Defense

Nebraska's Black Shirts are fast becoming more famous than Paul Dietzel's Louisiana State Chinese Bandits of a few years ago.

By holding Colorado to only 51 total yards (minus three in rushing) in last week's 21-3 victory, the Black Shirts dropped their average in total defense to 133 yards.

There has been somewhat of a "return to normalcy" after the "new deal" starting in the Big Eight Conference, team statistics released show.

Ever-strong Oklahoma is now challenging Nebraska in total offense. Rushing-minded Kansas is pulling up on the leading Cornhuskers.

However, Nebraska still holds comfortable leads in five of the six divisions—rushing offense, passing offense, total offense, rushing defense, and

total defense—and has moved into a close second in the only category escaping its grasp, passing defense, as it makes a bid to become the only team in the Conference ever to sweep all six titles.

Oklahoma State is still stubbornly holding onto the pass-defense leadership, allowing an average of 59.4 yards a game through the air. Nebraska has surrendered an average of 69.5 in one more game. Thus, the Cowboy advantage is now 120 yards.

Kansas marched for 259 ground yards against Oklahoma State, while Colorado held Nebraska to its lowest rushing total of the year, 137, enabling Kansas to move within 44.6 yards of Nebraska's 256.7 per game.

Nebraska did build its rushing defense lead, though, posting the Conference's best rushing-defense effort since

since the Cornhuskers held South Dakota State to a 17 in the opener last year, when they held Colorado to a minus three. Nebraska leads 63.7 to 130.0 for Missouri.

The Huskers continue to hold a commanding lead in points scored with 192, while Kansas is a distant second with 98. The race in fewest points allowed is closer, however, with Missouri's 44 total ka's 37.

Ohio State 10 over Iowa; Maryland 6 over Penn State; Michigan 13 over Northwestern; Michigan State 15 over Wisconsin; Notre Dame by 7 over Navy; Purdue by 1 over Illinois; Syracuse 20 over Pitt; Texas Tech by 1 over Rice; Southern Cal by 14 over Washington; TCU by 3 over Baylor; Texas by 17 over SMU.

Adna Dobson Up For Silver Award

Sixty-nine men who played collegiate football as seniors in the season of 1939-40 have been cited by their alma maters as candidates for this year's Sports Illustrated Silver Anniversary All-America Awards.

Adna A. Dobson, nominated by the University of Nebraska, is vice president of Dobson Brothers Construction Company of Lincoln, a nationwide construction firm.

He is also Chairman of the Board of Mid-Continent Laboratories of Lincoln, a member of the board of Midwest Life Insurance Company and of the First National Bank.

Dobson was a guard on Biff Jones' 1939 team that won seven, lost one and tied one, and Dobson won three football letters and one track letter at Nebraska.

He received a BA from Nebraska and a BS from Cornell where he was an assistant football coach to Carl Snavely. He served in the Seabees, where he rose to the rank of lieutenant commander.
