

'Mad, Mad Mania' Expects Record Crowd

Brashear said an expected influx of parents for the game and Parents Day is quite certain to push the total higher.

Tickets will remain on sale in the Union until game time

on Saturday, and there will be some Kosmet Klub workers selling tickets outside the stadium before and after the game. Tickets will be on sale at Pershing auditorium up until show time, but they will cost \$1.75, compared to \$1.50 for tickets bought at the Union before the show.

Before the snow and during the intermission the audience will have a chance to vote for Prince Kosmet and

Nebraska Sweetheart. The voting booths will be taken down after the intermission and representatives of the Student Council will count the ballots. The winners will be announced and crowned after the show.

Also to be presented after the show is the winner of the Stephen Cass Memorial Scholarship, in the amount of one semester's tuition. The award has been set up in memory of Steve Cass, a former Kosmet Klub Vice President who was killed in a car crash three years ago.

The award is made to an undergraduate student in electrical engineering who meets the requirements of a high academic average and showing outstanding leadership in campus activities. Letters are

sent out to everyone who meet these requirements, and they submit reports on their campus activities and academic records.

This is the third year the scholarship has been given, and according to KK President Terry Vogt it should be self-perpetuating in another year.

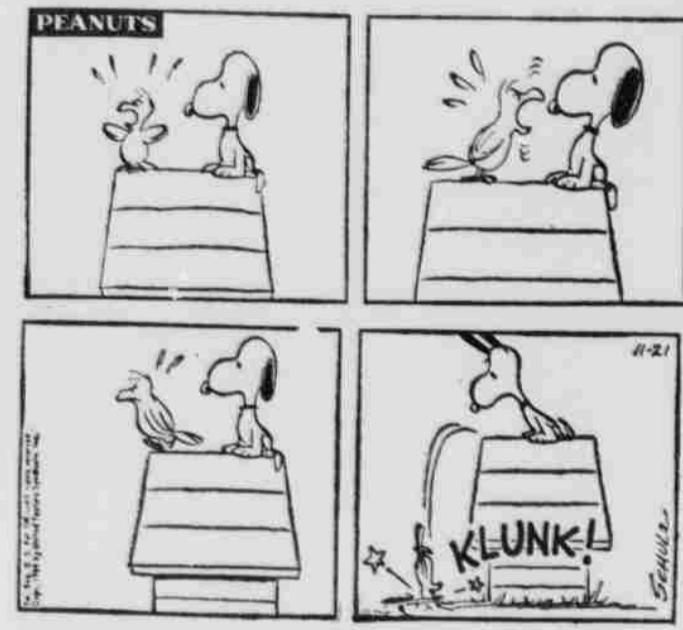
Frosh Honorary To Initiate Eleven
