

# SAE's Host Cage Tourney

Ball control, balanced scoring and five points spelled victory for the University of South Dakota in the annual Sigma Alpha Epsilon Midland Basketball Tournament Friday and Saturday.

The So. Dak. SAE's fashioned a 56-54 last second win over host team Nebraska Friday and won the championship Saturday with a 61-58 squeaker over Iowa State.

Nebraska placed third in the four team tourney with a 63-46 victory over the hapless Drake quintet who dropped their first game in a 54-46 decision to Iowa State.

The Championship game between South Dakota and Iowa State was hard fought with the score knotted 30-30 at the half.

Iowa State's Tim Lowe unloaded a barrage of shots to take game and tournament single game scoring honors with a 29 point total to have his effort fall short in face of the balanced So. Dak. attack.

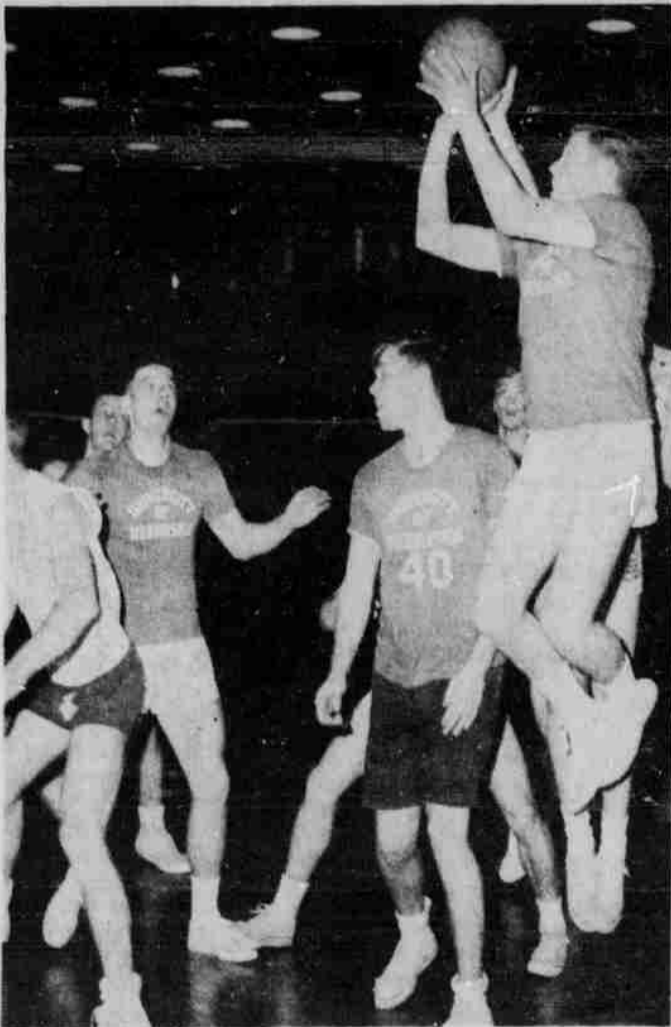
The attack featured scoring by all eight team members who were led by Dave Lemaster with 16, Roger Dammer and Denny Asper with 15 and 13 respectively.

Asper and Dammer paced their team with a 16 and 14 point total respectively in their Friday night victory over Nebraska.

Lowe's single game 29 point output was followed by a 23 point total registered by Nebraska's Denny Stewe who garnered his points in the 63-46 route over Drake Saturday.

The Drake team was never able to close the 25-17 half-time deficit with only Randy Sparks finishing in double figures with a 10 point total.

The Nebraska squad was led by Stewe's 23 point totals

followed by Kent McCloughan and Bill Johnson with 17 and 13 points respectively.

The tourney's high scorer was Iowa State's Lowe who finished with a two-game 45 point total, netting 11 for 11 from the charity stripe. Nebraska's Johnson and McCloughan shared second place honors with each having a 36 two game harvest.

The annual SAE Midland Basketball Tournament was initiated by the Nebraska Lambda Pi chapter two years ago and features a three-foot traveling trophy that goes to the tourney's victor.

## Old Baseball Ruling Forces American League Executives To Sell Their CBS Stock

Baseball owners agreed Monday to allow Baltimore board chairman Joseph Iglehart to keep his share in the Columbia Broadcasting Company, who now own the New York Yankees.

The agreement states that the Oriole chairman must put the shares into an irrevocable nonvoting trust in compliance with an old baseball statute involving conflicting interests. The ruling had not been invoked since Rogers Hornsby was forced to sell 150 thousand dollars worth of St. Louis Cardinal stock in 1923 after he was traded to the New York Giants.

Four other baseball executives agreed to sell their CBS stock in order to conform to the rule. They included Lee MacPhail, Oriole president; Zanyl Krieger, Oriole treasurer; Tom Yawkey, Boston Red Sox president; and Arthur Allyn, Chicago White Sox president.

The conflict-of-interest law,

which prohibits a baseball man from having interests in more than one team, was brought up when 80% of the Yankee stock was purchased by CBS for \$11,200,000 and later another ten per cent was picked up from former owner Del Webb.

## Turkey Day To Feature Husker, Sooner Clash

### Game Marks First All Big 8 TV Show

#### Date Switch Gives Teams Preparation Period

The Nebraska Cornhuskers and the Oklahoma Sooners—two historic rivals—have been selected to share the spotlight in the first nationally-televised Big 8 Conference football game.

Wayne Duke, Big 8 executive director, announced Monday that the Husker-Sooner game, slated for Nov. 20 next fall, has been changed to Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 25, and will be carried nationally by the National Broadcasting Co., which TVs the NCAA gridiron schedule.

This will mark the first time two Big 8 teams have met on national TV, although conference teams have been on national TV against non-conference opponents many

times in the past.

The game between the two Big 8 powers will move into a prime Thanksgiving Day spot which has been filled in the past by such traditional meetings as Texas-Texas A&M and Auburn-Alabama.

Several schedule switches had to be made in order for the Big 8 to meet the Turkey Day request. The Oklahoma-Oklahoma State game, slated for Nov. 27, will be set back until Dec. 4.

With the Husker-Sooner clash now moving from Nov. 20 to Nov. 25, the two clubs will have 11 days to prepare for the TV spectacular. Nebraska plays Oklahoma State on Nov. 13, the same day Oklahoma meets Missouri.

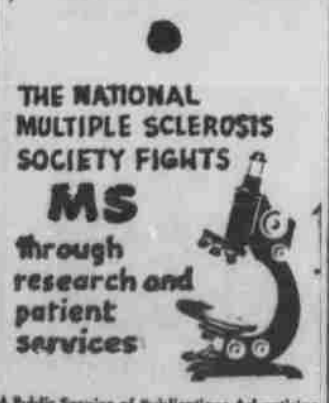
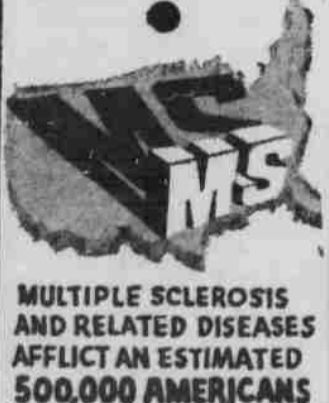

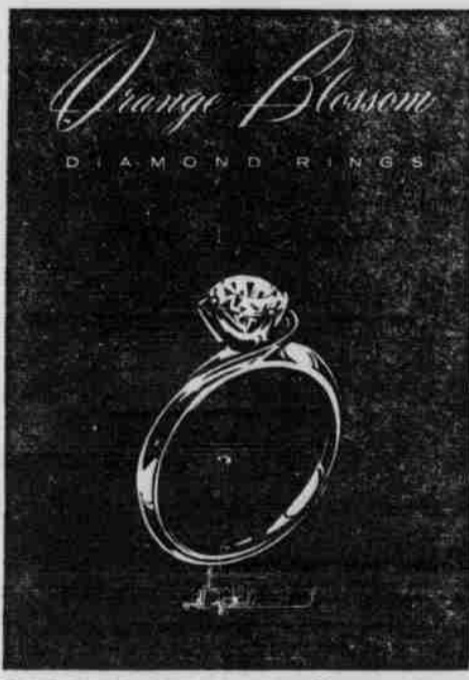
