Youth Movement Hits Big Eight Tracksters

The old hands of Big Eight Conference track keep pace, but, the sophomores around the league are beginning to take over in some events on the eve of the Big Eight's track and field championships May 14-15 at the University of Nebraska.

Colorado's Jim Miller swept to a new American record in the 330 intermediate hurdles with his :36.1 and Missouri's Robin Lingle got a 4:01.7 mile, one of the best in the country this year, but the talk is still about a trio of Oklahomans, a Nebraskan, and an Iowa Stater, all of whom are sophomores.

Oklahoma's Jim Johnson, who missed the indoor season while playing basketball, backed into veteran Russ Laverty of Oklahoma State in their dual last weekend. Laverty hit his season's peak of 6-9 in the event, but Johnson went almost one better—6-9 1/4 to be exact.

This amounts to the best high jump ever recorded outdoors by a Big Eight athlete, surpassing the 6-9 1/4 efforts of Colorado's Leander Durley and Missouri's Steve Herndon—John Nunley of Oklahoma did have a 6-10 last year, but a sticky surface was used to hold the bar on the uprights in the wind. Herndon, incidentally, is a sophomore, too, owning a 6-10 1/4 indoors.

In that same meet, Oklahoma State's Miles Lister became the king of the discus throwers with a cast of 177-

Mizzou's Lingle Captures Spotlight; Four Minute Mile Possibility Evident

Husker thinclads will be seeking to put "a tiger in their tank" this weekend as Big Eight Indoor champ Missouri comes to Lincoln for a dual meet Saturday afternoon.

After last week's crushing loss to Colorado, the Nebraskans will be looking for an upset victory. Field events begin at 12:30.

Headlining the meet will be the Husker's usual fleet runners: Dave Crook in the 440 and 220, Charlie Greene in the century, and Jim Wendt, half mile. Crook will meet stiff opposition from Charlie Allen in the 220 and the Tigers' Bill Rawson and Charlie Conrad are likely to push Wendt in the 880.

But everyone may have to take a backseat to the Big Eight's outstanding miler, Missouri co-captain Robin Lingle. Last week in a meet with Kansas State at Columbia, Lingle put together a 4:01.7 mile which ranks as the best time run in the United States this season.

The Huskers' Lynn Headley, who suffered a pulled muscle at the Drake Relays is expected to be able to compete. He will run with Greene and Tom Millsap in the 100-yard dash and will also run the 330-yard intermediate hurdles.

Nebraska field event participants will also meet stiff competition. High jumper Jack Cramer will be pitted against indoor king Steve Herndon who has gone over

6-9 this season and Jim Beltzer will toss the shot with another indoor champ, Gene Crews.

Next week Lincoln becomes the center of Big Eight track activity as the conference championships get underway May 14.
