Thirty-two University fourth-year students in architecture have presented their case for development of a Nebraska Farm Museum before a critical jury of Nebraskans.

The students, under the direction of Professors Dale Gibbs and Robert Ginter, were asked to come up with fresh ideas on the subject as a part of their special designs course work.

The jury members, made up largely of persons from Omaha, are particularly interested in the students' project because of a desire on the part of a number of Nebraskans to build such a museum west of Omaha near Boys Town.

In general, the University students have come up with two open air museum concepts or themes which they felt might have some potential for depicting and telling the story of Nebraska farms.
