

Cather Residents Choose Officers

Cather Hall has held its first hall-wide officer elections. Officers elected for this year are Tony Redman, president; Don Chamberlain, vice president; Harlan Rubotson, treasurer; John Decker, social chairman; and Rod Basler, secretary.

Officers last year were se-

lected by a committee of house presidents. The change was part of a totally revised constitution passed by the hall recently, according to Alan Crews, last year's Cather president.

Other changes provide for spring election of hall-wide officers, spring election of house presidents and social chairmen and a revision in the judiciary body of the Cather government.

The judiciary committee will be made up of five randomly picked house vice presidents, with the hall vice president presiding, Crews said.

The committee will act on hall matters only, not disputes that may arise on individual floors.
