AWS Board Discusses Orientation

A big sister or coed counselor program for AWS Freshman orientation Week was approved by the AWS Board Monday afternoon.

The motion was introduced by Elaine Kallos, orientation program chairman.

"A successful orientation program could create a good image of AWS," she said. She stressed the need for more personal contact between new students and AWS.


Miss Kallos explained that about fifty girls would each adopt a floor in the residence halls. During freshman orientation week, they will emphasize the programs of AWS, other than rules, demerits and hours.

The big sister program will establish good relationships and communication between AWS and women students, she said.

Big sisters for the program which will begin next fall will be selected by the AWS board from applications. Applications are available from Miss Kallos.

A motion was passed to delete the phrase "Women may not visit men's boarding houses or apartments" from the Campus Handbook.

It was also decided to print 5000 copies of the AWS handbook to be distributed in the fall. This is the first year the handbook has been printed and it will contain information information about AWS, including rules for the senior key system.

IDCC Tables Representation Article At Tuesday Meeting

A constitutional article about representatives to an interdorm council was tabled by the Interdorm Coordinating Committee (IDCC) Tuesday evening.

The article presented by the constitutional committee contained two plans which called for either equal representation or proportional representation.

President Marv Almy said that in the future representation would grow into a system of one dorm, one vote. Because of the size of new dorms, a proportional representation system would make the body so large it would be cumbersome.

More Weight "We do need representation on the population basis at the present time," Ted Suhr, Selleck, said. Such a system will give more weight to the larger dorms.

If the council expects the larger dorms to pay the larger burden of expenses there has to be some weighting by population, according to Suhr.

Tom Holeman, Abel, suggested that the size of the council be limited, but the voting power be spread by giving each dorm one representative but a number of votes proportional to its population.

Small Groups "It would maintain the entity of small groups to make the council function better," he added.

"Represented dorms have to act as an entity and not as a representative of each individual," Jim Ludwig, Cather, disagreed, "and a complete weighting system is unrealistic."

If the council grows too large, it might just be an approving body of the executive, Ludwig stated.

The method of representation will be considered at the IDCC meeting next Tuesday when it will continue drafting a constitution for the interdorm council.

Temporarily approved by the IDCC were the executive council association court and committees sections of the organizational structure article.

The Executive Council shall consist of the president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer.

Association Court The association court shall consist of the vice-president as the chief justice and four justices elected by the council.

Standing committees of the council will be social, scholastic, activities and administrative coordinating.

Each dorm will have one representative on all standing committees.

Students To Vote On 17 Amendments

University students will vote on constitutional amendments concerning the proposed office of second vice president in the ASUN election next Wednesday.

Student Senate passed a motion several weeks ago suggesting this office and asking the students to consider it as a constitutional amendment.

At the same time the new office is voted on, students will also elect a second vice president who will take the office if it is approved.

The following, which must run three times prior to the election in the Daily Nebraskan, according to the ASUN constitution, is a copy of the proposed constitutional amendments.

STUDENT SENATE—CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

- In Article V, Section 1, part A. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
- In Article V, Section 2, part A. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
- In Article V, Section 2, part B, and Part B, Section 1 and 2. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
- In Article V, Section 2, part C. Add the following provisions:
 - The Second Vice-President
 - Election. The Second Vice President of the Association shall be chosen on the basis of a separate election.
 - Eligibility and Term of Office. The eligibility and term of office of the Second Vice President of the Association shall be identical with those of the President of the Association.
 - Replacement. In case the Second Vice President of the Association shall become unable to fulfill his duties by reason of disqualification, disability, death or impeachment and conviction, replacement for the position shall be appointed by the President with approval of the Senate.
 - The position of the Second Vice President shall become effective upon the approval of the above amendments in the general election of 1966.

8. Article VIII, Section 1, part J. Insert the words, "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".

9. Article VII, Section 2, part A-2. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".

10. Article VII, Section 1, part H. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".

11. Article VII, Section 2, part A-5. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".

12. Article VII, Section 2, part B. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".

13. Article VII, Section 2, part C. Add the following provisions:
 C. The Second Vice President. The Second Vice President of the Association shall have the following powers.

1. To be a member of the Electoral Commission and Executive Committee.

2. To assume such duties within the Executive branch as shall be assigned by the President of the Association.

3. To hold a seat on the Senate with no vote.

14. Article VII, Section 2, part C. Insert the words, "through the Second Vice President" between the "President" and "for".

15. Article VII, Section 3, part B-5. Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".

16. Article VII, Section 4, part C. Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice Presidency".

17. Article XI, Section 1, part A. Insert the word "First" between the words "outgoing" and "Vice President".

Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".




