Trask, Pepper Urge Participation

Two speakers at a Young Democrats meeting Tuesday night urged the students to participate actively in the year's political campaigns.
"Your potential is very great," Dr. Davil Trask, associate professor of history, said.
"We're counting on you," Dr. F. J. Pepper, executive secretary of the college YD's, said.
Pepper said he feels the Nebraska Democratic Party will be able to take the governorship and the U.S. Senate positions this year as well as to elect Democrats to the House of Representatives.
Trask discussed the national and state elections as a "detached" observer. The Democratic Party is "not likely to win a single election this fall," he said.
Schaaf attacked Abbott, charging that he had attended "only one" Student Senate session this year. "Mickey Mouse or not (Student Senate)," Schaaf said, "Abbott is still going to have to work under that system. I don't feel that he has genuine interest in the existing student government."
"Responsible leadership on my part" was Schaaf's response to the question of what he expected to offer to Senate. "Is he qualified to lead?" Schaaf asked indicating Abbott, "I don't believe he is."
Abbott and Schaaf clashed several times during the hour and a half debate.
"This Bill of Rights (the CPDP proposal) means that we can stand up as men in the intellectual and state

community," Abbott said.
"That in no way answered my question," Schaaf replied. "It certainly did," Abbott fired back.
"Never mind," Schaaf answered.
Each candidate made a ten minute presentation and each had five additional minutes later for rebuttals and questions to opponents or for clarifications of points. The floor was then opened for questions which continued for about half an hour.
Schaaf explained his approach to a bill of rights saying that the purpose of the Student Senate would be to "represent students to the Board of Regents in the hope that they will consent to what the students want."
Carl Davidson asked Schaaf if the intent of his bill of rights plan is to "help the administration make our decisions for us about certain rules?"
Davidson added, "Abbott is giving you the power to make those decisions yourselves," before he was called to order for upsurping the floor.

Students To Vote On 17 Amendments

University students will vote on constitutional amendments concerning the proposed office of second vice president in the ASUN election next Wednesday.
Student Senate passed a motion several weeks ago suggesting this office and asking the students to consider it as a constitutional amendment.
At the same time the new office is voted on, students will also elect a second vice president who will take the office if it is approved.
The following, which must run three times prior to the election in the Daily Nebraskan, according to the ASUN constitution, is a copy of the proposed constitutional amendments.

- STUDENT SENATE-CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS
1. In Article V, Section 1, part A. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
2. In Article V, Section 2, part A-4. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
3. In Article V, Section 2, part B, and Part B, Section 1 and 2. Insert the word "First" before "Vice President".
4. In Article V, Section 2, part C. Add the following provisions:
The Second Vice-President
1. Election. The Second Vice President of the Association shall be chosen on the basis of a separate election.
2. Eligibility and Term of Office. The eligibility and term of office of the Second Vice President of the Association shall be identical with those of the President of the Association.
3. Replacement. In case the Second Vice President of the Association shall become unable to fulfill his duties by reason of disqualification, disability, death or impeachment and conviction, replacement for the position shall be appointed by the President with approval of the Senate.
4. The position of the Second Vice President shall become effective upon the approval of the above amendments in the general election of 1966.
5. In Article V, Section 2, part E. Insert the words "First and Second" before "Vice President".
6. In Article V, Section 3, part B, number 1. Insert the number "2.5" in place of the word "six".
7. Article VI, Section 1, part A. Insert the words "First and Second" before "Vice President".
8. Article VII, Section 1, part J. Insert the word "Six" instead of the word "five" before "Commissioners".
9. Article VII, Section 1, part J. Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".
10. Article VII, Section 2, part A-2. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".
11. Article VII, Section 1, part H. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".
12. Article VII, Section 2, part A-5. Insert the word "First" before the words "Vice President".
13. Article VII, Section 2, part C. Add the following provisions:
C. The Second Vice President. The Second Vice President of the Association shall have the following powers:
1. To be a member of the Electoral Commission and Executive Committee.
2. To assume such duties within the Executive branch as shall be assigned by the President of the Association.
3. To hold a seat on the Senate with no vote.
14. Article VII, Section 2, part C. Insert the words, "through the Second Vice President" between the "President" and "for".
15. Article VII, Section 3, part B-5. Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".
16. Article VII, Section 4, part C-2. Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice Presidency".
17. Article XI, Section 1, part A. Insert the words "First" between the words "outgoing" and "Vice President".
Insert the words "First and Second" before the words "Vice President".

Sponsored by the Student Religious Liberals of the University, the Lincoln United Nations Assn., Lincoln SANE and the Social Action Committee of the Unitarian Church, Gottlieb will speak on the topic, "Where Now in Viet Nam?"
The coordinator of the march on Washington for Peace in Vietnam last November, Gottlieb served as advisor to the interdenominational group of clergymen who visited South Viet Nam on a fact finding mission in July, 1965.
He will appear on the Junior League sponsored television program, "Cabbages and Kings," earlier Sunday.
