

Few Lineup Changes Planned For Cornhusker Grid Squad

Following Sunday's scrimmage Husker, football coach Bob Devaney said he doesn't plan making too many lineup changes. Films of the scrimmage are being reviewed this week by Devaney and staff.

Opposing units of Devaney's team played in shifts of about 15 minutes duration in Sunday's action.

In the opening session the first offensive team quarterbacked by Wayne Weber and Bob Churchich went against the second defensive unit.

In the line, the first offensive team had Dennis Richnafsky and Dennis Morrison at ends, Gary Brichacek and Bob Taucher at tackles, Jim Osberg and LaVerne Allers at guards, with Kelly Peterson and Bob Hill alternating at center.

Backfield

The backfield had Weber and Churchich at quarterback, with Ben Gregory and Harry Wilson alternating at right half, Charlie Winters at left half, and Pete Tatman at fullback. Ron Kirkland didn't see action because of a shoulder bruise.

Lou Narish, defensive lineman, and Len Janik at a line-backing spot looked good on the second defensive unit which Devaney declared was the mythical winner of the first match, because they had been more successful at stopping the offense than the offense had been at moving the ball.

The offensive unit used both the T and I formations. Right end Richnafsky did most of the passing for the quarterback tandem.

Second Session

In the second session the first defensive unit, the "Black Shirts," went against the second team offensive club quarterbacked by Al Fierro and Ernie Sigler.

Defensive tackle Dick Czup was missing from the "Black Shirt" defense unit because of an injured right ankle he suffered in Saturday's scrim-

mage. Czup said he had pulled some ligaments in the ankle and would be sidelined for about two weeks.

The first defensive unit in the line had Langston Coleman and Jerry Patton at ends, Wayne Meylan and Jim McCord at tackles and Carel Stith at a middle guard post.

The defensive backfield was composed of Lynn Senkbeil and Rick Coleman as linebackers, Larry Wachholtz at safety, and Marv Meuller and Jim Hawkins at corner back spots. Al Kuehl was the "monster" and he also stepped in at Coleman's right end position for a few plays.

Black Shirts

The "Black Shirts" stymied

the second offense for the most part, but the offense did reel off a couple of good plays. One of them was a 35-yard pass completion from Fierro to right end Sherwin Jarmon.

In the third session of the afternoon the second team defensive and offensive units clashed in pretty much of a stand off.

Before retiring to the showers the first offensive unit and the "Black Shirts" went at each other in a fifteen minute battle. In that encounter defensive left end Jerry Patton looked particularly good. Cozad native Ken Brunk saw action at left halfback along with "Choo Choo" Winters on the offensive unit.

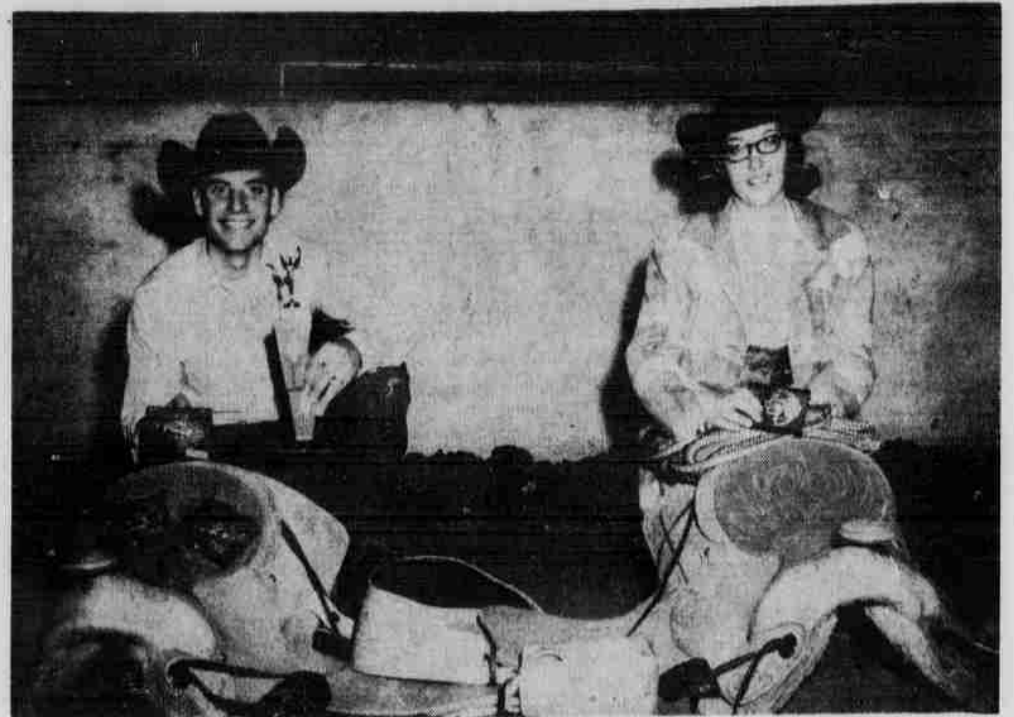
