## Editor: Dormitory Residents To Have Individual Pictures

Dormitory residents will not be pictured in the Cornhusker in groups, Mary Ann Deems, Cornhusker editor, announced Thursday.

"We're striving for consistency in the yearbook and the best way to achieve it is to have all living units represented with individual pictures," Miss Deems said.

Dorm residents have recently expressed an opinion advocating group pictures rather than the traditional individual pictures.

"We don't want to take the pictures in groups because it would be extremely difficult to get every member of the floor together at one time," Miss Deems said.

Even if we tried to take a picture of a group of 40 from different floors, there would be problems of how to label the pictures and identify the people, she said.

The rating the Cornhusker receives has nothing to do with its unwillingness to take group pictures, she said. Since 1960 the Cornhusker has received the highest rating—All American.

"We are interested in keeping the rating," Miss Deems said, "but we don't feel

group pictures would keep us from being highly rated."

The Cornhusker staff wants to present a book which will be meaningful to every student, she said, and the best way is to handle individual pictures instead of groups.

There is a clear division between organizations or honoraries which are pictured as groups and living units.

"We take all the Greek living units as individuals and want to take all dorm residents as individuals."

The entire Cornhusker staff

has agreed that individual pictures should be taken of dormitory residents for consistency.

"You can't recognize people very well in group pictures anyway," Miss Deems said. "For example, each floor in Abel houses 80 men."

The number of pages on which each dormitory is represented is dependent on the pages the dorm is willing to buy and the number of pictures which can be fitted on the page. Pages cost \$40 a page.

## Major Rights Groups Asked To NU Teach-In

Representatives from 11 major civil rights groups in the country will be asked to speak at a teach-in on "Black Power" to be held this semester at the University under the sponsorship of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).

The motion was passed at the Wednesday meeting of SDS to hold the teach-in because, according to one member, there had been no open dialogue on the subject of Black Power and the term was generally misunderstood by the public.

Members of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) will be invited to attend. The program for the teach-in may also include some University faculty and students.

No definite date has been set for the teach-in.

Other suggestions for SDS action this year included a teach-in on China, to be held some time in spring. Also, the advisability of holding a regional Symposium on the New Left as an internal educational project was discussed.

Cater Chamblee and Al Spangler were nominated for the office of president. Vice presidential nominees are: Doyle Niemann, Frank McClanahan, Terry Tilford and Joe Knight. Maggie Young, Dennis Bartels and Joe Knight were nominated to run for secretary-treasurer of the organization.

Elections of officers will be held at the SDS meeting next Tuesday at 8:30 p.m. in the Nebraska Union.
