

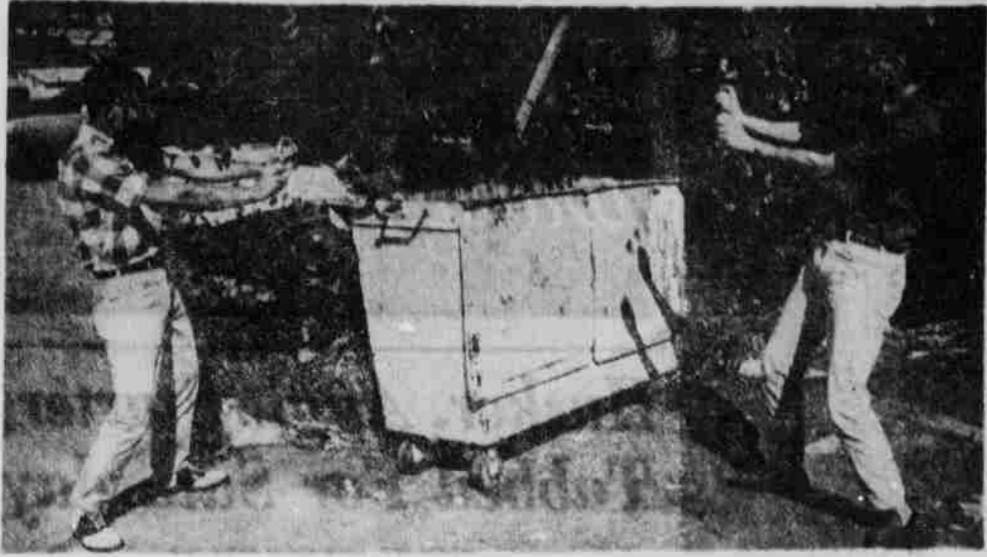
## Utah Game Broadcast By KNUS

KNUS, the campus radio station, will broadcast the Nebraska-Utah State football game Saturday.

The broadcast, which may be received on 880 AM frequency, will start at 1:30 p.m. with pre-game warmups at 1:45 p.m. and kick-off at 2 p.m.

The program, under the direction of Lee Coney, assistant professor of journalism, will also include a 15 minute wrap-up and a half-time roundup of scores around the nation.

Students who will be handling this week's broadcast, which is the second such for the station this fall, will be Ray Depa and Mike Elgert on play-by-play, Mike Schlatter, on statistics, Sandra Dose, John Buchfinck and David Jovanat at the studios in Nebraska Hall and Bob Wilson and Steve Sondag on engineering duty.

## 'Freeze The Flies' Campaigner Finds Insect Situation Normal

When Dr. Kenneth Pruess of the Entomology Department was approached for an explanation of the presence of the autumn pests, he laughed heartily.

"As far as I know, it's a normal situation," Pruess said. He scoffed at the suggestion that there were any more insects around now than ever.

Pruess told the Nebraskan reporter that he didn't see anything humorous in the

current fly population, but to go ahead and write the story and he would "sit and read it and laugh."

"Insects are around all the time," Pruess said, avoiding technicalities. "They are always present in one form or another."

Pruess said that they would be evident in this conspicuous form "until we get a good hard freeze."

He also pointed out that "flies congregate on cool days."

Students may sleep easy tonight knowing that the insect problem is "normal."

## Radio Station Promoters Seek Approval Of Regents

The success or failure of the proposed student FM radio station will depend on the enthusiasm and interest shown by the students and the University, according to Bob Wilson, chairman of the incorporators.

Promoters of the "University of Nebraska Student Broadcasting Corporation" met Thursday to discuss what organizational steps are needed in order to establish an FM station.

Articles of Incorporation have been written and the promoters will meet with the Regents Oct. 15 to seek approval for using the University's name and to incorporate.

Monday the promoters will meet with the Alumni Association to present their plans and try to gain support of the organization.

"Through a massive letter writing campaign we hope to contact the Nebraska Broadcasters Association, student organizations, living units and other campus radio stations" to inform them of the group's ideas, Wilson said.

Nebraska is the only major college that does not have a radio station, he added. The promoters will try to find a location for the antenna which will enable service to both campuses and the majority of the off-campus students.

The promoters hope the station's operation will be similar to that of the Daily Nebraskan. Larry G. Keating, resident agent of the new corporation, said the station will be a service to students and "at the same time be de-

tached from campus politics."

Wilson said that the corporation's Board of Trustees, consisting of three faculty members and two students elected at large from the student body, would serve in a capacity similar to that of the Publications Board.

He requested interested students to write to the promoters in care of the Nebraska Union or phone him.
