The Nebraska and Utah State football teams won't be the only people playing in Memorial Stadium Saturday. There will be also 2,300 high school musicians blaring out with a traditional Band Day performance.

The concept of a Band Day originated at Nebraska back in 1939 and since that time has spread nationwide. Donald A. Lentz, now Director of Bands at the University, was the man responsible for organizing Nebraska's first Band Day.

The idea behind it was to attract a larger crowd for Memorial Stadium. Since its conception back in '39 and during the years when Nebraska football wasn't that good Band Day has been successful in attracting a lot of people who would otherwise not attend to watch Nebraska play football.

But times have changed. Nebraska now plays to a full house nearly every game, and in case you didn't know, Band Day has been changed this year too.

The high school bands will march in a downtown parade and play concert style from stadium seats, but their will be no marching or formations on the field. And that's what has been most popular with Band Day customers in the past.

The reasons reportedly behind the new move are damage to the field from the thousands of marching feet and possibly a greater chance of injuries to the players if the weight of the bandmen compacts the sod.

This all sounds well and good, especially if the weather is rainy, but it now has to be considered a break in a fine old tradition which truly belongs to Nebraska and no one else.

One of the Cornhusker Yearbook staff members thought of a possible solution. Maybe if all the bandmen took off their shoes...

"They got penalized three times for being offside and once for having 12 men on the field—the 12th being the coach after the third offside penalty. We may employ that strategy again, I'm not sure."

The theme for tonight's pep rally will be "Knock 'em With Noise." Any kind of noisemaker is acceptable except fireworks. The rally will be held on the Memorial Stadium steps at 6:30 p.m. A parade will start on the south side of the Nebraska Union at 6:15 p.m., travel up 16th Street, turn left on R Street and finish at the stadium. Husker Co-captains Larry Wacholtz and Bob Churchich will speak.

The Cornhuskers will try to present Coach Bob Devaney with the 75th victory of his career Saturday. Counting Nebraska's victory last Saturday, Devaney's Nebraska record now stands at 37-1 in regular season play and 39-6 overall for a percentage of .866. His lifetime percentage is now .822, based on 74 wins, 16 losses and five ties.

Huskers To Face Utah State

A Band Day crowd of over 63,000 is expected to be on hand Saturday to watch Nebraska take on a pass-happy Utah State team in Memorial Stadium.

Directing the Aggies' aerial game will be quarterback Ron Edwards; his primary receiver is flanker-back Dave Clark. Each time Edwards completes a touchdown pass or Clark

catches one, a new Utah State record is set.

Husker quarterback Bob Churchich tied Fran Nangle's touchdown pass mark of 12 TD passes last week against TCU and if he can come up with a touchdown strike against Utah State he will set a new Nebraska career passing record.

Nebraska will have two different starters in the offensive backfield than opened against Texas Christian last Saturday.

Sophomore Dick Davis is scheduled to start at right halfback in place of Harry Wilson with Charlie Winters going at the fullback spot instead of Pete Tatman, but both Wilson and Tatman are expected to see plenty of action.
