

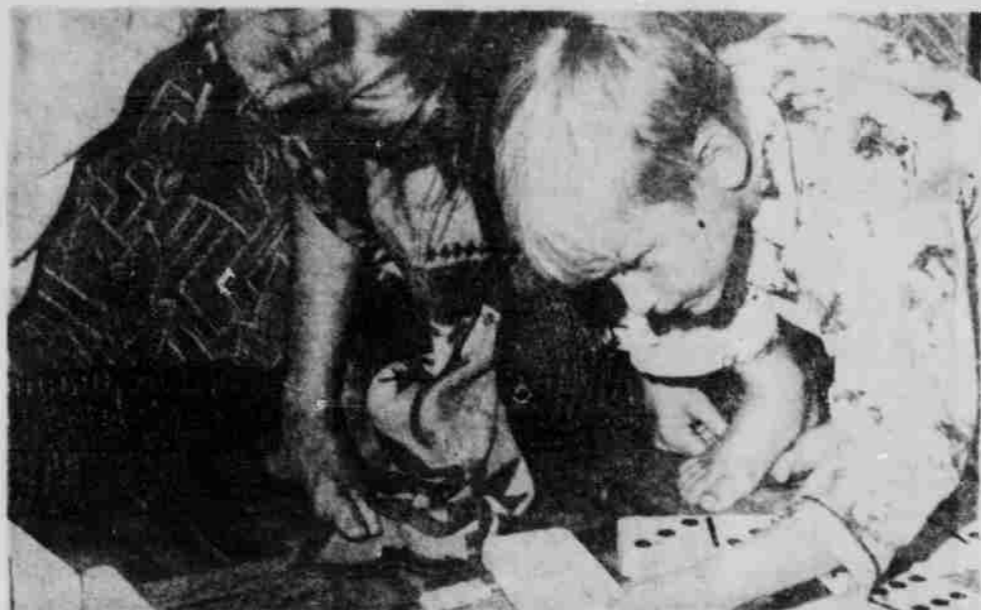

## High Court To Review Beard Case

NEW YORK (CPS) — The U.S. Supreme Court has been asked to review the case of a Richmond Professional Institute student who was kept out of the college for his senior year because he sported a beard and long hair.

The Virginia liberal arts college refused to allow Norman Thomas Marshall to register in September, 1965. Marshall is seeking an injunction to prevent the college from requiring a shave and hair cut as prerequisites.

In a brief filed with the high court on his behalf, the American Civil Liberties Union contended that the school's "arbitrary, capricious and unreasonable" action refusing registration on account of his grooming violated the constitutional rights to free expression, due process of law, privacy and protection against cruel and unusual punishment.

Marshall, a 26-year old senior, resigned a scholarship and his post as editor of the college's art and literary magazine last year in protest against the school's "arbitrary" ruling on student dress and grooming.

"There is no limitation on mustaches," Dr. George Cover, president of the Institute, said at an earlier trial. "If a man wants to take a chance walking down the halls with a quite long one, he can go right along."

## Adult Education Enrollment Grows

Registrations are up 12.6 per cent over last fall in the University of Nebraska's Extension Division adult class program.

Edor W. Ellingson, head of the program, said the adult class enrollments total 2,061 as compared with 1,848 last year. The count is based on class enrollment, not individuals.

The number of class sections, most of which meet at night, has increased to 92 from last year's total of 73. Course offerings went from 63 to 70 with additions in the areas of English and art.

In addition to the adult class program the Extension Division also offers instruction to Nebraska high school students, to correspondence students throughout the nation and abroad, and conducts a few field courses in Nebraska, mainly for teachers.

## Florida State Takes Poll Of Prospective Greeks

What sort of university freshmen want to join fraternities and sororities? A recent study at Florida State University outlined several basic differences between prospective pledges and independents.

Freshman girls aspiring to enter sororities tend to come from a higher socio-economic group than non-aspirants, were more active in high school extra-curricular activities and dated more frequently.

Non-sorority girls ranked significantly higher on college aptitude tests according to Ph.D. candidate Gary Widmar.

Most of the independents said they would prefer to be regarded as outstanding students.

Most of the sorority hopefuls said they would prefer to be remembered as leaders.

Among the boys, few such differences could be found in measured attitudes, family background, self-perceptions or secondary school experience.

## CU Coed Fails Course, Appeals English Grade

Boulder, Colo. (CPS) — If you don't like your final grade, take it to court. In a precedent-making case a University of Colorado coed has done just that.

Jacelyn Dieffenderfer has charged her English Literature instructor, Miss Kaye Bache, with improperly giving her a failing grade for misconduct — cheating on a final examination.

The 20-year old junior seeks an injunction from Boulder District Court requiring the university to change her grade.

Instructor Bache contends that similarities between Miss Dieffenderfer's and another student's examinations could not have occurred without cheating.

Miss Dieffenderfer maintains her work in the course deserved a "B" or better.

A university disciplinary committee called to hear the case and found the evidence against Miss Dieffenderfer insufficient to determine guilt. When no action was taken as a result of the committee decision, the coed decided state courts were her only alternative.

The suits names as co-defendants the University Regents the President of the University, the Dean of Arts and Sciences, the Dean of Admissions and Records, the Registrar and the instructor University Attorney John P. Holloway said he will respond to the summons but is unsure of his legal approach since the case is without known precedent.
